Penguins and Puffins

We have had a great week. In Maths, we have been learning about 'more' and 'fewer'. We have been playing top trumps to help us reinforce our learning.

In Literacy, we have been sequencing the story of 'Star in a jar' and writing a sentence using cvc words. Our topic this half term is 'Let's explore!'.

We have been learning all about Diwali this week. We have had lots of fun making rangoli patterns and diya lamps. Well done everybody!


Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had another great week full of new learning. In Literacy we have been analysing the text looking for features such as; 'doing' words that end in 'ing' - verbs, Capital letters, Question marks and the word 'and' used to join to ideas. The children have also enjoyed thinking about words to describe Rapunzel - thinking about what she looks like and also about how she is feeling in different parts of the story. Year One are working so hard - Ask them to tell you all about nouns, adjectives and verbs!

Our maths focus has been number bonds this week. We have moved from using concrete apparatus such as cubes and counters, to using a 'Part, part, whole model' and now using a number sentence. We have been pairing numbers to make 10. A great game to practice this is - Save The Whale: Learn bonds of 10, 9, 8, 7, 6 or 5 (ictgames.com)¹

In Geography this week we have been exploring maps and floor plans. This linked really well to last week's activity looking at aerial photographs. We then received a message from a rather lost alien that wanted to find his way around our classroom! We then set out to make some 'messy maps' using objects from around the classroom. The children really enjoyed this activity and made some great floorplans using counters, cubes, blocks and even conkers!

Our highlight of the week must be our Art lesson. Thank you for the old t-shirts and aprons! We used the three primary colours, red, blue and yellow to work out how to make the secondary colours, orange, purple and green. See if your child can remember.

Owls and Robins

In literacy this week, Year 2 have been working on using descriptive language. We have stepped inside of different scenes from our book, The Night Gardener, and have worked hard on using descriptive features to describe what we can hear, see and feel.

In maths, we have been working on adding and subtracting across a 10. We have been trying hard on different techniques to do this.

We have started our new geography topic this week too. We have started to recap our understanding of continents and labelling these on a world map and ordering them from biggest to smallest. We really enjoyed taking part in some songs to help us remember this information too.

In art, we have continued to complete our final piece of artwork implementing all of the skills we have been working on for our drawing techniques. These look great!

Also this week, we have taken part in lots of different assemblies and events, including making a class wreath for remembrance day.

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have learnt about friction in Science and have investigated how friction effects sliding objects in the classrooms.

In our new Geography topic, we have been learning about the coldest part of the planet - Antarctica! For Literacy, we have been using our new focus text - Leaf to understand features of an outsider's tale and have written some incredible sentences!

We have made a simple machine with a lever and a linkage in Design and Technology which can wave! On top of all of this, we have been practising spellings in our new books from Oxford Owl and all aiming to get better.

We have had an amazing assembly from Tom from the DSA all about being the best you can be, and we have prepared fabulous poppy wreaths for our remembrance event. Overall, we have had a great week of learning. An excellent week, well done Waterbirds!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in literacy, the children have enjoyed drama sessions to help understand the emotions of different characters. They have explored how writers build descriptions through background, middle ground and foreground details.

In maths, year 6 have had a challenging week adding and subtracting fractions. They have persevered when they have found it challenging and had to do many different steps. Year 5 have been exploring factors, multiples and square numbers. Lots of tricky vocabulary to remember.

In science, we started our new unit on light. The children learnt that light is faster than sound and travels in straight lines. In RE, we started to discuss what we already know about Christianity. During geography, the children have learnt where in the world the Alps are.

But this week the children were most excited about the woods. They loved their first session as did the teachers. Their imaginative play was superb! We had Christmas displays and tyre roller coasters being made!
