Class News

Penguins and Puffins

Another great week in Reception this week. In Maths we have been consolidating out number bond facts for 5, we are getting very speedy at these!

In Literacy, we have enjoyed sharing the poems from the book 'Commotion in the Ocean', which describe different sea creatures. We then worked together in groups to choose a sea creature and come up with our own poems - we enjoyed sharing these with our classes.

At the start of the week, we loved the Rock Kidz event and had such fun rocking out in the hall! We have also continued to explore with watercolours to create different sea scenes and enjoyed a music session, listening to the 'Carnival of the animals aquarium' piece of music and trying to move in time to the music, like some of the sea creatures in the video. Well done for another super week Reception!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

In Literacy this week we have been exploring the features of a recipe. We have decided that when we write a recipe, it will look very different to a story. We have spotted lists, bullet points, numbered steps and even 'Top Tips'! We have started to plan our own tasty recipes to entice the wild animals - Can your child think of any interesting ingredients?

In Maths we have focused on using a 'hundred square' and looking at how the numbers follow a sequence. We have investigated the patterns of counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and played guess the number by hiding numbers from our friends. Goldfinches had a great afternoon in the Woodland this week - roasting marshmallows on the fire. Staff were very impressed by the children's patience in the woodland and how they accessed the different areas with confidence. Woodpeckers added to our outdoor weaving loom in our outdoor area this week - tying, attaching and weaving different materials.

In Geography this week we have looked at the human and physical features of the city Shanghai in China. It has been great to see the children apply their knowledge to new situations. Next week we will decide if would prefer to live in Sandbach or in Shanghai.

Owls and Robins

This week in year 2, the children have been drafting a letter to their new MP to encourage her to invest in Sandbach Park, explaining why the park is important to children and the local community.

We have been looking at seasonal changes and the signs of summer (no laughing please!). The children have been discussing ways to keep themselves safe in the sun over the school holidays.

In DT, the children have been designing a vehicle that would be suitable for a safari. Ask your child about axles, wheels and chassis.

In Maths we have been completing our final lessons on statistics, looking at how to represent data and extract information from different tables. In Geography, we have been identifying human features on the British coast line.

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have been learning how to order delicious ice-creams in France. In Literacy, we have written our biographical hot tasks all about incredible life of Jacques Cousteau. The teachers have been impressed with all the facts the children have retained about this man's amazing life.

We have been learning about our local river the 'Wheelock' in Geography - ask the children to give you some facts. All of us really enjoyed the Rock Kids day organised by Miss Sheridan, particularly Mr. Durham who won the air guitar competition
