We have been working hard in Phonics again. Please remember you can access the virtual classroom videos through the Tapestry links and regular practise will help us to remember the sounds we might be struggling with. Please continue reading your book/flash cards and signing the diary every nightgreat job on this so far!

In Maths, we have been counting with 1:1 correspondence and practising saying how many altogether. The children are getting very good at knowing the last number they say when counting is the total number of objects.

In Literacy we have written our own class story about The Something. The children came up with some fabulous ideas and we orally rehearsed our sentences.

We had a great visit to Wheelock Methodist Church to learn about how babies are welcomed into the Christian faith. A HUGE thank you to parents for supporting this trip. You were amazing! Keep up the great work, Reception!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had another busy week in year 1 this week.

In Literacy we have been practicing writing expanded noun phrases to make our sentences more exciting to read. We started to plan our recount messages as Major Glad and have chosen a scene from the story to write about.

In maths we have completed our numbers to 10 unit and now we are starting to look at how to solve number problems using a part whole model.

In Art we were applying our drawing skills and knowledge to create an observational drawing of a pumpkin. The children enjoyed experimenting with different media and marks.

In History we were comparing teddy bears from the past with modern day bears. We enjoyed sharing our own teddy bears whilst having a teddy bear picnic.

Science was lots of fun this week. We challenged the children to build the three little pigs' houses using an array of different materials including bricks, sticks and even sweets!! We then discussed what properties materials need to have to be good materials for house building.

Owls and Robins

This week the children have continued to explore the features of a letter. They have been looking at the four types of sentences; command, statement question and exclamation. In music the children have been leaning to strike a pose in music. In maths, the children have wrapped up the numbers to 100 unit by completing the end of unit assessment and practising 3, 5 and 10s. In art we have been looking at how to draw different expressions on simple faces, we then created our own characters and thought about the pose we wanted them to be in.

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

Another great week in Waterbirds.

In Literacy, we have been looking at Newspaper reports and the different features we need to include. We really enjoyed interviewing each other as witnesses to come up with some direct quotes to include in our writing.

In Maths, year 4 have just started addition and subtraction after finishing their rounding unit. Year 3 have started to look at exchanging in addition and subtraction.

In Science, the children have been looking at the muscles and the bones in the body. They are loving getting to know the different names.

We have finished our History unit this week with the children showing off all of their learning about the Victorians and Tudors.

In Art, the children have done some amazing observational drawings, zooming in on aspects of the picture and pulling out all of the detail.

We have been furthering our knowledge of French by learning the French names of rooms in a school.

The children are loving PE, and are developing their netball skills well.

Last week is year 4's last lesson in the woodlands, they have been fabulous and really enjoyed engaging with the natural environment.

On top of all of this, we have been working on using our purple pens for addressing feedback and practising our Harvest Festival songs! What a wonderful week!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week started off with a workshop in air quality led by Cheshire East. The children made Lego models of the school and identified how and why or air quality might be poor. We looked at little changes that could be made such as turning off car engines when they are not being driven.

During maths, year 6 have progressed on to multiplication and in particular multiplying 4d x 2d numbers. They have found this tricky but have persevered and started to crack it. TTRS has really helped with times tables understanding. Year 5 have continued to look at subtraction. They have been exchanging to help their methods.

In literacy, we have had a big push on SPaG. The children have learnt about different suffix endings, active and passive voice and formal language. They are learning to apply these in their own writing.

During science, we continued to look at the impact of exercise, diet and sleep on our bodies. History saw the children exploring Viking achievements. In computing, the children continued to learn how to use Excel. In RE, the children started to learn about Diwali and Holi. They enjoyed looking at how colourful the festivals are.

Another great week for our oldest children. Have a fantastic weekend!
