Cygnets and Pufflings

In Literacy we have been focusing on the four parts of the Storm Whale by Benjie Davies – octopus opening, build up bear, problem penguin and elephant ending.

In Maths we focused on counting skills. We have been counting fixed and moveable arrangements of objects.

In topic we have been sorting animals into their natural habitats and researching sea creatures.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Well done to all of year one for completing the phonics screen check this week, you were all amazing and we are so proud of you!

In literacy the children have begun to write their own hunting narratives about Little Red going to catch a wolf. The children have used lots of new vocabulary and we are very proud of the standard of their writing.

In maths we have started our unit on money. The children have been exploring different coins and notes. We played a game of shop where the children had to find the right coin so that they could buy an item from the shop. Have a game of shops with your child at home and see if they can remember the different coins.

In geography this week the children have been using a map to draw an aerial view of the local area ensuring they include both physical and human features. The children then used symbols and colours to represent each feature.

On Wednesday it was international day of play, so all the children enjoyed a fun afternoon sharing a game that they had brought in. Thank you for your kind donations towards supporting a child's right to play.

This week in Literacy, the children have begun to analyse our I WAGOLL 'Frankie Flapper!' The children have identified the features of a narrative and the techniques the writer has used. As well as this, the children have

In Maths, we have continued to look at fractions. The children have been I: finding a third, finding the whole and looking at unit and non-unit fractions. The children have also developed their arithmetic skills looking at missing number subtraction problems.

In Science, we have planted seeds to grow our own cress!

This week's History lesson delved deeper into the different features of castles. The children then had lots of fun designing their own castle!

In Geography too, the children were designing - this time, creating posters to advertise Weymouth to tourists!

The children thought about older people who they respect in PSHE for our topic "Changing Me".

In ICT, the children showcased their learning from previous weeks - making a poster to explain how to safely and effectively search on the internet!

In RE, the children learned about Synagogues. The children learned the significance that different objects / features hold for Jews.

We're sure the highlight of the week for many children was the extra hour of play they enjoyed on Wednesday!

Another wonderful week Year 2 - well done! We hope you have a restful weekend ready for our residential on Monday!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

This week year 3 have finished their maths unit on time. It has been rather tricky, so we would like year 3 to continue working hard on telling the time at home. In literacy, we have looked at the genre and language features of a lost narrative and have completed some role-play to gather ideas for our own lost narratives next week. In geography, we continued to learn about human and physical features. In computing, year 3 have been learning about solving and creating simulations. Finally, we have had to find lots of resilience this week as we had our DT sewing day! The children made Egyptian Collars, where they learnt skills of applique, embellishment, running stitch and cross stitching. The children supported each other with kindness and patience as they helped each other fix sewing mishaps!

Kingfishers and Lapwings

We are so proud of the children this week for completing their multiplication checks so calmly and confidently. Thank you so much for all the support you have given them at home too. This week we began reading a new story called, 'Into the Woods' by Anthony Browne. It's a wonderful book with a mix of fairy tale characters and incredible illustrations that the children have been enjoying looking at and from this they will write their own stories about getting lost in the forest. In maths, we have moved onto time. Some of the children have found the concept of converting from minutes to hours tricky as you do not divide by 10 or 100 so if you get the opportunity to talk about this in a real-life context, it would really help them. In R.E. we have begun thinking about special places and places of worship. In computing, we are learning about the positives and negatives of AI and played a really fun drawing game which the children can play with you at home. We have begun a new science

topic of sound and have been learning about how sound waves travel- we even acted it out! The children have been learning about how sound travels differently through solids, liquids and gas. In the next few weeks, the children will be completing their end of year assessments to monitor their progress and attainment. Have a wonderful weekend!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in maths, Year 5 have been exploring decimals. They have been multiplying them and sequencing different numbers. They have worked hard to use the place value to support their understanding. In literacy, the children have completed their hot write. They have been writing formally and using synonyms/ antonyms to be creative. The children have attempted to use subjunctive form to express a wish. We have been impressed with their powers of persuasion!

During geography, the children have been discussing different local issues such as the housing developments proposed in and around Sandbach. We discussed the impact that these could have on the traffic, population, supermarkets and schools. The children were very mature in the discussions. In RE, we have started to explore how Christians showed commitment to God. We looked at a story from WW2 and how individuals showed commitment towards others - often risking their own safety. In French, we have started to discuss items that would be taken to a beach. During My Happy Mind, we have looked at how we relate to others and how we might treat a situation differently to another person. During art,

The year 6 children have continued to develop their enterprise ideas. They are busy creating exciting stalls to share at the school summer fair. They have also looked at their leaver's assembly. We have been discussing roles and responsibilities.

Year 6 have been lucky to visit the woods this week. This will be their final sessions there - we hope they make the most of this opportunity!

Finally, on Wednesday, we enjoyed sharing the International Day of Play together. The children built things using junk materials, played games such as chess and enjoyed activities outside such as hoops, chalk and creating different games. It was a lovely afternoon. It was so nice to hear the children laughing and not wanting to use a screen.

We hope that you have a wonderful weekend - hopefully the sun will reappear!

DROP-IN WITH THE EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY TEAM



The Educational Psychology (EP) Service is offering parent/carer drop-in sessions at Cheshire East Family Hubs, held once per half term in both the North and South localities. These informal sessions are an opportunity to discuss concerns, seek advice, and explore strategies to support your child. They are not for Local Authority processes (e.g., EHCPs or placement changes) or child assessments.

Examples of topics include:

- Concerns about speech development
- Managing challenging behaviours
- Social skills or play difficulties
- Anxiety or school-related issues
- Preparing for adulthood

Parents/carers can book a 30-minute slot by calling their local Family Hub. Sessions will be themed based on age groups (e.g., Start for Life, Primary, Secondary/Post-16) to align with the Family Hub journey map. Afternoon sessions will coincide with the Little Stars stay-and-play group for children with SEN.
