We have been celebrating Christmas all week and learning about different traditions around the world. We have decorated our tree, started to make Christmas cards and made Gingerbread Men in our dough area.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Wow it has been a busy week in year one this week. We are super proud of all the children for performing a wonderful nativity on Wednesday and we hope that you all enjoyed it as much as we did.

In literacy this week we have completed our hot write so the children have been editing their work using a purple polish. The children are getting a lot more confident at editing their mistakes and adding in words to make their sentences more exciting to read.

In maths this week the children have been learning different methods to help them with solving subtraction problems, one of these methods is using a number line. We also challenged the children by getting them to tackle some addition and subtraction words problems.

In art we finished our Clarice Cliff plates by adding on our tree design. We did this by adding a small amount of watered-down black paint and then blowing through a straw to make the trunk and branches. We will be displaying some of the children's artwork in the main office so keep an eye out for it.

Owls and Robins

This week has been all about Christmas Celebrations! Wednesday night was the Christmas Fair, when many of the children were about to get a glimpse of Santa. Thursday was the year 2 Crafternoon Tea. It was wonderful to see so many of parents and grandparents enjoying the children's singing, baking and crafting.

In maths, the children have finished up this unit on addition and subtraction with the end of unit quiz ready to start the next unit on shape. We went outside to use some of the science equipment to measure outdoor temperatures throughout the day. We have discussed the weather and changing climate here in the UK and overseas.

Our DT lesson this week was about baking gingerbread, with the children using their own designs to create delicious Christmas biscuits. In literacy, we have finished exploring the text The Night Gardener and have written our plans ready to write our diary entries next week.

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week we have concluded our learning about forces and magnets with an end of unit quiz; we are now preparing for an exciting STEM day next week where we will be making a vehicle using some of our scientific knowledge.

We have furthered our knowledge of coding in Computing using the online app - Scratch. As well as this, we have enjoyed learning about how different religions welcome babies into the world in R.E. We enjoyed the watching the Nativity story with a guest assembly on Tuesday, loved watching KS1 rehearsing their own Christmas story and many children appreciated the Christmas Fair held at the school by Friends of Wheelock on Wednesday night.

We are still working hard on the conclusion to our hot task writing an information report about Polar Bears and have seen some excellent work by the children - well done Waterbirds! Overall, we have had an enlightening, productive and *beginning to feel a bit like Christmas* week. Super job, well done Waterbirds!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week Year 5 and 6 have been busy learning Christmas songs to perform next Wednesday evening. Also, the Year 6 children visited Lightley Court to sing for the residents on Friday. The sang beautifully and the residents had a lovely time.

During maths, Year 5 have continued to work hard on equivalent fractions. They have struggled with the concept but have preserved and used this knowledge to add fractions. Year 6 have finished their final unit on measure. They converted from metric to imperial. They have also worked on mental arithmetic skills.

During literacy, we finished our final hot write. The children wrote their letter from the father to the son. They worked hard to plan and write in coherent sentences which flow. We also looked at using a range of sentence types.

In RE, the children discussed how reliable the Bible is. In French, we continued to learn different locations, such as supermarket, butchers and bakery. In PSHE, the children looked at an inspiration Paralympian of their choice.

We had our final woodland session of the term. The children, and adults, loved the camp fire and eating smores washed down with a hot chocolate. Thank you so much to Miss Camm, Miss Joyce, Miss Millward and Mrs Moses for leading our sessions. They have been amazing!
