








Harriet's Story!

Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

A super week this week, Reception. We have been working hard in Phonics and have been playing lots of Fred games to secure our blending skills. In Literacy, we have been sequencing the story of 'The star in a jar' and have written CVC words to describe how Yan was feeling. In Maths, we have been exploring the composition of number 5 and have represented 5 in lots of different ways. In our topic, we have been learning all about 'Diwali' and how Diwali is celebrated across the globe.

Keep up the great work, Reception.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had another busy week in year one this week.

In literacy we have been using the suffix 'ing' to describe what some of the characters in Rapunzel are doing. The children then read the example text and used a highlighter to find the different features that we have been learning about in our sentence accuracy.

In maths the children all completed the end of unit check on shape. On Thursday we had lots of fun playing with all the different number games for number day.

Both Woodpeckers and Goldfinches really enjoyed their woodland sessions this week and have been asking all week when they get to go back. Our woodland sessions link really nicely to this terms science topic which is all about seasonal changes.

In geography we started a new enquiry question which is 'What is it like here?". The children loved exploring google earth to look at different towns, villages and cities. We located the school on an aerial photograph and then worked in groups to label our own aerial map of Wheelock.

In whole class read this week the children really enjoyed finding the rhyming pairs in our new text 'Oi frog'. We then challenged the children to write their own rhyming couplets.

Owls and Robins

This week in Literacy the children have continued to look closely at their new text "The Night Gardener". The children have been looking at new vocabulary from the text and WAGOLL and using this to create their own sentences. They have also been looking closely at the images and setting descriptions in the texts, to gather ideas for their own writing.

In Maths, the children have started their new unit on Addition and Subtraction. The children have been focusing on: finding 10 more and 10 less, adding and subtracting tens and solving addition and subtraction problems. The highlight of the children's week in Maths has certainly been Thursday when the children have lots of fun playing Maths games!

In Science, we have been looking at life-cycles. The children confidently matched baby animals to their parents and enjoyed learning the scientific names for lots of baby animals! The children then looked more closely at the life-cycle of a human and the different names given to humans at different times in their life - e.g teenager / elderly.

In DT, the children have been thinking about building a chair for baby-bear! The children had lots of fun exploring what makes shapes and structures stable and conducted an investigation using modelling clay to help with this!

In PSHE, the children thought about Anti-Bullying week and completed some work linked to this. It was wonderful to see the children being so passionate during a "Kindness BINGO!" activity - the children worked hard as classes to mark off different ways of showing kindness around school! More, the children have also been considering their differences and they have created posters about all the ways that we can be different - e.g interests / favourite things / hair colour!

In Music, the children have been changing the lyrics to a well-known song to make it more festive! The children have also been practising songs, ready for a little performance at the Year 2 Christmas afternoon. The children are working really hard to sign to some of the songs too!

In Computing, the children started a new topic on Internet Safety. The children had a good understanding of how to keep safe online and enjoyed discussing the use of Avatars online - why some people may use them to look differently!

This week, the children have also considered the importance of Remembrance Day. The children were very respectful during our 2-minute silence on the school field and have written acrostic poems about Remembrance Day.

Well done Year 2!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

Year 3 have had another fabulous week this week. They are working their way through their multiplication and worked hard on their multiples of 3 today. They can use TTrockstars to help to support with their times tables! In Literacy, we've looked at the features in our book 'Rhythm of the Rain' and started to use them in our writing.

In Science, they have started their topic looking at forces and were so excited for the start of it. This links with their new DT topic of information design using electrical systems.

Thank you to all parents who attended our poppy craft and writing afternoon. It is very appreciated!

Kingfishers and Lapwings

Year 4 have had a lovely week. The children have enjoyed the ongoing times tables competition as well as their games lesson on Thursday. They have also enjoyed learning about Remembrance and completing their own descriptive poems about the trenches. Thank you to everyone who joined us to help complete our poopy art work today. In maths we have started a new unit of work and have been focusing on calculating the area of shapes by counting squares. In Literacy we have explored the Tempest and used new vocabulary and phrases in our own sentences. In science we carried out an investigation to test the viscosity of different liquids - we poured them on to a ramp and timed how long they took to reach the end. A busy week overall! Have a lovely weekend.

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

Another busy week for the children. On Monday, the children were extremely respectful for our Remembrance Day silence. The also did a piece of writing to commemorate it.

In maths, year 6 have continued to work on adding and subtraction fractions. They focussed on mixed numbers. Year 5 have been multiplying and dividing by 10,100 and 1000. We also enjoyed playing board games for number day. In literacy, we have looked at the writer's knowledge and how they craft their text. In RE, we are learning about the Christmas story and its validity. In geography, we have looked at birth and death rates. During PSHE, we have delved into racism as well as anti-bullying this week. In art, we have tried to create Mayan spirit companions.

Thank you to all those who joined us this afternoon for our Remembrance art. It was lovely to see you all.
