Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

This week in Reception has been full of rich learning experiences across all areas of the curriculum!

We've been busy exploring instructions and how to follow and understand them clearly. The children had lots of fun applying their phonic knowledge to label items they might need to plant a seed. In Maths, our focus has been on understanding the composition of numbers 6 to 9, using the familiar and supportive '5 and a bit' structure. The children showed great confidence in identifying the parts that make up each number and began to explore how the number 10 can be composed in different ways. We introduced the concept of the 'ten-ness of 10' through hands-on activities where children created their own collections of 10 objects. They enjoyed using double dice frames, 10-frames, and finger patterns to represent and subitise the two parts of 10. We encouraged them to spot a larger part first, especially when using the '5 and a bit' structure, and then subitise the smaller part. These experiences are helping to build a strong foundation for number sense and early addition skills. In our topic work, we've been learning all about life cycles. The children were fascinated by the journeys of the butterfly and frog, and we explored how both creatures change and grow through different stages. We looked at real images and diagrams, talked about each stage from egg to adult.

It's been a fantastic week of hands-on, engaging learning. We're so proud of how the children are developing their independence, confidence and curiosity each day.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Another Sunny week and Year 1 have had a great week.

In Literacy we have all finished writing our return narratives and have 'purple polished' our writing. It is great to see some of the children spotting their own mistakes and putting in Capital letters and full stops when they re-read their own work. Well done Woodpeckers and Goldfinches.

In History this week we have focused on Christopher Columbus and his exploration to the Americas. We discovered that his story was not as positive as expected. See if your child can tell you all about it!

The highlight of our week was definitely in Design and Technology where we made our fruit kebabs. The children tasted different fruits first so they could decide what to put on their kebabs. They then designed, chopped, assembled and finally ate their kebabs. It was a fun afternoon!

Our classrooms were a sea of Green on Friday as we supported Mental Health Awareness week - thank you for your support. We did some mindfulness yoga, learnt a new song and contributed to a whole school display linked to our community.









Owls and Robins

This week in Year 2, the children have been busy completing their 'Hot Writes' in Literacy. This was a letter to the King asking him to lift the ban on the dark. The children had some fantastic reasons for why we need the dark and they produced some persuasive arguments!

In Maths, the children have continued to consolidate their arithmetic skills. The children have thought also about how to solve word problems and have explored different statistic representations - eg block diagram / pictograms.

In Science, we have been thinking about what plants need to survive.

It's been an extra-Arty week this week, with the children delving into the new topic "Map it Out!". The children started the topic learning about the Artist Sir Eduardo Paolozzi. Then, the children created imaginative sketch-maps of the journey from school to the church!

We discussed "conflict" in PSHE - how this makes us feel and how we can move past it.

We thought about Internet Safety in Computing, focusing on what a scam is.

Finally, in RE we looked at three guiding ideas in Humanism - being curious, being free to do what makes you happy & showing kindness to the world, animals and people.

A fantastic week, yet again!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

Year 3 have had another fabulous week this week.

In Literacy, we have been preparing to write a Secret Diary imagining we are Egyptologists. The children have come up with some exciting vocabulary and thought carefully about their style of writing. They have enjoyed looking closely at different Egyptian locations and artefacts.

In Maths, the children have started their unit on time. This is always a tricky topic to learn, however the children are doing really well with it. If you could support with telling the time at home with your child, this would be a great extension of learning for them.

In Science, the children enjoyed looking at the roots of some plants. They enjoyed looking at a variety of plants and their roots. If you are doing any weeding this weekend in the garden, ask your child what they have learnt!

In RE, the children have continued looking at Hajj, the pilgrimage Muslims take. They have enjoyed looking into the different parts of the journey.

In Reading, the children are thoroughly enjoying the book 'The Nothing to See Here Hotel'. They are so engaged with the different characters and are doing a great job at analysing the differing personalities on show.

The children are having a great time in PE practising their athletics. We have seen some real skill on show and the children are making great progress.

One more week until a well-deserved break for the children 🙂

Kingfishers and Lapwings

We have had a fantastic week of learning in Year 4 this week. In maths, we are focusing on decimals still, but it is getting more complicated, as we look at partitioning decimals, and making a whole with decimals. In Literacy, we are loving writing our mischief narrative, and we are being extremely inventive with the naughty tricks our characters play! I just hope they don't bring this learning home... or you will have a very messy kitchen!

In Art, our prehistoric painting became very creative, as we used lots of natural herbs and spices, flowers and leaves to create paint. Our computing and music topic have linked this half term, so we are using the computers to help us to compose a jingle for the yummy biscuits we created last half term. We played detective in History, looking at artefacts from Sutton Hoo to work out what they were, what they were used for, and what this told us about the Anglo-Saxons. The children made some great deductions! Well done Year 4, for a fantastic week of learning!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week, in maths, year 5 have been looking at coordinates and translating shapes. They have worked hard to read the coordinates accurately. During literacy, we have completed our dual narrative hot write. I have been impressed with the children's language choices and

attempts at speech. In science, we completed our investigations on thermal insulators. The children found that metal was an excellent insulator. In history, the children enjoyed researching British historical figures. We looked to see who is significant in British history. We discussed Lily Parr, David Attenborough and Stephen Hawking. The children then decided who should feature on a. Bank note. During computing, the children designed a cereal box using the computer programme. What I am most proud of is the year 5's attitude towards the SATS tests for year 6. Every morning, we have worked in the hall to accommodate our peers. They have been calm, respectful and considerate towards the Year 6 children and I couldn't be prouder of them! Well done year 5!!!

Year 6

This week, year 6 tackled their SATS tests. The children have been magnificent. They've approached each test with confidence and determination. Everyday they've come into school with a wonderful attitude. The whole school is so proud of all of you! I think everyone, children, teachers and parents, are all relieved they are over now!!!!! Friday is the day that year 6 love the most in SATS week- our annual water fight! The weather couldn't have been kinder either! Another great day! Well done year 6 - we are super proud of you all!!!
