

Class News

Penguins and Puffins

We have had a very busy week this week. We have been writing sentences about our plants in Literacy and have used adjectives to add detail to the parts of a plant.

In Maths, we have been exploring number tracks and have played lots of track games. We are super speedy at identifying missing numbers and can explain why numbers appear in the order that they do.

Within our topic we have been looking at the lifecycle of a butterfly and the children can now describe each part of the life cycle. We have been creating tissue paper collages of bees to develop our expressive art and design skills.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had another busy week in Woodpeckers and Goldfinches. We have been doing lots of phonics to make sure we can spot all our 'special friends' in new words. Don't forget to scan the bar code to have a go at the new 'Phonics Screening Practice'.

In Literacy his week we have enjoyed putting ourselves in Erins shoes! We have role played Erin getting cross with her family and explaining to them why we should save Black Rock. Erin has been busy writing in her diary to tell us what she is feeling. We have also started to write our own Diary entry for Erin.

In Maths we have explored 'Mass'. Using balances, we have compared and calculated the mass of different objects. This has been great fun. If you get the chance to use scales at home this weekend - let us know what you get up to.

Woodpeckers and Goldfinches continue to be excited to learn about explorers in History. This week we have compared a modern day explorer (Ellen MacArthur) with Christopher Columbus. We have talked about how Christopher Columbus is beyond living memory and that we only have drawings and no photographs as evidence of his travels. Can your child tell you something about each of the explorers?

Owls and Robins

We have had a productive, hard-working week this week in Year 2.

In literacy, we have been analysing our WAGOL, 'The Queen Who Banned Silence'. We have been applying the techniques within this text into our own writing, including using adverbials of time, conjunctions, contractions and expanded noun phrases. We will be applying all of this in to our own story next week.

In maths, we have moved on to position and direction. We have been learning subject specific language and applying this.

In History, we looked at the castles William the Conqueror built and why he designed them the way he did. In science, we completed our investigation on 'Do our feet get bigger when we get older?'. We really enjoyed investigating this.

Today, we have completed our D&T project - making a bag for a character. We worked really hard on the challenging task of sewing. We then cut out our design and stuck them on and then stapled the handles on. We have used lots of different ways to join materials. These look fantastic - well done to all of you for your effort with these!

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have been learning all about the characteristics of the five animal types mammals, fish, birds, reptiles and amphibians in science. We are beginning to tackle tackling the tricky concept of telling the time if you can help at home that would be greatly appreciated.

In Literacy, the children are now planning writing diary entries as though they are refugees escaping from terrible events. We have been learning about how to say the names of jungle animals in French and have enjoyed constructing our own Mayan cities in History, including pyramids, temples, observation towers and grand palaces.


In P.S.H.E. the children have been discussing friendships and considering the possibility of boyfriends and girlfriends and what that might be like when they are older.
