## Cygnets and Pufflings

What a great week! In Literacy we have been answering questions about Juniper Jupiter and have sequenced key events from the story. In Maths we have been subitising dice patterns and counting up to 10. We have been learning about woodland creatures and exploring their habitats and have created woodland collages in the style of Megan Coyle.

Well done to everybody who read 5 times this week - super work! Please read every night where possible as it really does make a difference.

Weekly challenge: Next week we will be learning all about nocturnal animals in the UK and starting to explore polar habitats. We will be focussing on Antarctica. We would like you to find out a fact about Antarctica. Please bring something in, draw a picture or write something that you can share with your friends next week.

## Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had busy week in Woodpeckers and Goldfinches. In Literacy we have been looking closely at the text 'Hermelin the Detective Mouse'. There is some interesting vocabulary in the text and we have tried to use some of the new words in our writing. We have explored Hermelin's character and how he feels throughout the story. The children have thought of some great questions that they would like to ask Hermelin too.

In Maths we have been working with numbers to 20 and writing our 'teen' numbers correctly. We have applied our knowledge of 1 more and 1 less when using a number line and continued to use pictoral representations to check our understanding of numbers to 20.

In History we have used our photographs - baby, toddler and present to talk about how we have changed over time. We have made a simple time line - starting with the present and working backwards into our past. We questioned why we had no 'future' pictures!?

In Science we have started our new topic - 'Animals including Humans'. We began by talking about our favourite animals and then found out how they were all different and we could sort them into different groups. Can your child remember the 5 different groups?

Goldfinches had a great time in the Woodland on Wednesday - We roasted marshmallows on the fire and enjoyed our amazing space outside with our friends. It was lovely to see our Wheelock Behaviours used by all the children.

#### Owls and Robins

Another super week in Year 2!

This week in Literacy, the children have continued to explore their new story 'The Bog Baby'. The children started the week considering the author's language choices. The children worked as a class to gather ideas for a setting description - thinking about what they could hear, see, smell and touch in the enchanted Bluebell Woods. The children then completed a 'cold write' using their ideas. We were impressed with the beautiful writing produced. At the end of the week, the children started to analyse the text - looking at its structure and the language features used!

In Maths, the children completed their topic on Shape! The children have been especially resilient learning to accurately count: faces, vertices and edges on 3D shapes! Can your child recall what vertices are? We're looking forward to starting our new topic on 'Money' next week!

Our Science focus this week, was to understand new vocabulary for our new topic - 'Living Things & Their Habitats'. The children looked at 5 key words from our topic - habitat, microhabitat, respiration, excretion and reproduction. To help the children remember the meaning of these words, they drew pictures! Can your child explain what these words mean?

In PSHE, the children thought again about 'dreams and goals'. As classes, the children created a goal for them all to achieve - considering if this was realistic and the specific steps they would need to reach this goal. Then, the children reflected on what step would be most challenging for them. Owls' goal is for all children in the class to complete the 'Kevlar' stage on Numbots, by the end of Year 2. Robins goal is for them to win the most golden tokens this half term!

The children enjoyed starting our new Geography topic - 'Why is our world wonderful?'. This week, we have looked at the UK. The children labelled the countries of the UK and their capital cities. Then, the children looked at significant human and physical features from around the UK. Can your child tell you about any of the places they learned about?

In RE, the children have been thoughtfully discussing Allah. The children learned about how important Allah is in the Islamic faith and why there are no pictures created of them.

Music was lots of fun again this week, with the children enthusiastically singing 'London's Burning' in a round!

## Sandpipers and Moorhens

This week year 3 have been putting their times table knowledge to the test by learning how to use expanded written methods to multiply 2d by 1d numbers. We have been continuing to learn about Jemmy Button in Literacy and have filled our working wall with lots of descriptive language ready to write our return narrative next week. The children have loved learning about rocks and exploring their appearance and putting them into groups of their choice. In art we have been sketching animals in the style of cave painting and using charcoal. We have also been learning about animals in French. In music, the children have started to explore 'The Planets' Orchestral suite by Gustav Holst. Year 3 are really enjoying their new units of work this term!

## Kingfishers and Lapwings

Year 4 have a had a brilliant week. We have been busy learning how to multiply and divide by 10 and 100 in maths and have explores related facts. In literacy, we have continued to focus on our setting descriptions and have identified features within an example narrative. In computing this week, we have begun our 2Logo unit where children had to write code to create different shapes. The children had the chance to put their debating skills to practice in

History as they discussed whether or not tribes of ancient Britain should have fought back during Roman invasion. Finally, in science the children sorted a range of appliances into mains or battery powered. A busy busy week! Next week swimming will begin, please check your emails for this information. ## Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

We have had a very busy week in Year 5 and 6.

During maths, Year 6 have continued to learn about ratio and proportion, whilst Year 5 have been learning about writing methods for multiplication and division. In literacy, we have been analysing the text and identifying how the author has created the text. We have also recapped how to use speech punctuation. In science, the children learnt about gestation periods in mammals and why they are different. We have explored Ancient Greece and where it appears on a historical timeline. In my happy mind we are discussing appreciation, whilst in French we are learning how to say what our favourite fruits are. In RE, we have looked at how Muslims show commitment and why this is important.

The lockers have arrived this week - the children are very excited. We are awaiting the bases and then the children will be able to use them. They look very smart.

We had our first woodland sessions too. The children had a wonderful time and started to explore how to make bridges. They did come back a little muddy, some classes more than others (Kestrels - oops!). It just shows how much fun they had! Make sure they have old clothes on as we will continue to have fun in the mud - sorry!  $\bigcirc$
