Year 3 enjoyed experimenting with the electrical equipment to try and light the light bulb. In French, the children have been learning days of the week, months of the year and all about Christmas in France. In No outsiders, we spoke about stereotypes using our vehicle text- The truth about Old People. We have had a fun week enjoying the theatre, making Christmas crafts and cards. The year 3/4 team would like to say a massive **congratulations** for superb end of term assessment results. The children have truly worked their socks off and have made fantastic progress. ## **Kingfishers and Lapwings**

Year 4 have enjoyed a great week to end a great term. In Literacy, we completed our hot writes and neatly published our brilliant Information Reports, showcasing everything we have learned about structure, vocabulary and subject knowledge. In Maths, we focused on multiplying by 1 and 0 before completing our end-of-unit test. The children achieved fantastic scores and should be very proud of their hard work. In Science, we looked closely at the results from our evaporation experiment and discussed the importance of carrying out a fair test to ensure reliable results. In DT, we rounded off our time in the woodlands by enjoying marshmallows around the fire — a lovely way to celebrate our learning and teamwork. To get us into the Christmas spirit even more, we filmed a few Christmas carols for you to enjoy, created festive Christmas cards using our fingertips to design twinkling Christmas lights, and enjoyed a trip to the theatre to watch *The Little Mermaid*. We had the best time and were incredibly proud of everyone for their fantastic behaviour during the trip!

## Kestrels and Red Kites


We started this week with two road safety activities. Our first one was led by Cheshire Fire Safety. We learnt about being safe when out and about on the roads - the key message was arrive alive. We should stop, look, listen and think. We discussed the different types of safe crossings. Did you know we have zebra, toucan, pelican and puffin crossings? During our second talk of the day, we looked at home safety. The fire service gave the children some great advice on fire safety and how quickly fire can spread. We discussed how being low to the ground is good when there is lots of smoke in the room.

During maths, we finished our final fraction unit of the year. The children have worked extremely hard to understand how to add and subtract mixed number fractions, this has been challenging but the children worked well to convert to improper fractions and then back to mixed numbers.

In science, we finished our forces unit by completing our end of unit check. We also did a STEM task where we had to get Santa to land safely with a parachute. We tested different materials to see which helped him to land slowly and safely. We have designed Christmas jumpers during French and labelled them too. In D&T, we used the microbits to create a thermometer for an animal. We also used Lego to make a case to hold the microbit too. In D&T, we created animal monitoring devices using the microbits and Lego. The children created a thermometer and a case to put it in. We then used Tinkercad to create a 3D digital version of our case.

On Thursday, we had a wonderful time at the theatre watching the Little Mermaid. It was a great show with lots of singing, dancing and acrobatics. Whilst today, we have made Christmas cards, created baubles and watched festive films.

It has been an excellent half term. We are really proud of the progress the children have made. They have settled into UKS2 really well. We hope you all have a peaceful Christmas and a fantastic New Year. See you all in 2026!



## **Eagles and Hawks**

Year 6 have had an exciting and hands-on week across the curriculum. In DT, the Hawks and Eagles classrooms have been transformed into miniature playgrounds, with pupils designing and building models featuring swings, slides, climbing walls and sandpits. The creativity and imagination on display has been fantastic to see. In science, the children explored renewable and non-renewable energy sources, thinking about how we power our world and the impact of different choices. Meanwhile in maths, they have been developing their understanding of metric and imperial units, including practical conversions such as centimetres to inches.

We've also had lots of fun preparing for Christmas, and we're delighted to share our Christmas carol singing—please do take a moment to watch it on the school website. All of Year 6 have had a wonderful half term, and we would like to wish every child and their families a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. We look forward to seeing you all in 2026!
