

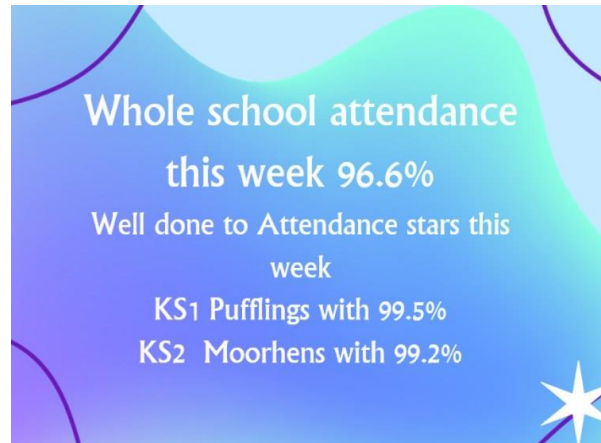

## Safeguarding News

### Supporting Families During Major Sporting Events

As many families enjoy following major sporting events this summer, we would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone that support is available for those who may be experiencing difficulties at home.

Research has shown that periods surrounding high-profile football matches can sometimes coincide with an increase in domestic abuse incidents. While sport itself does not cause abuse, factors such as heightened emotions and alcohol consumption can contribute to challenging situations for some families.

At school, the safety and wellbeing of our children remain our highest priority. Our staff are committed to providing a nurturing environment where every child feels safe, supported and listened to. If we have any concerns about a child's welfare, we will always work sensitively and appropriately to ensure they receive the support they need.

## Class News

### Cygnets and Pufflings

Reception have had another super week - it has been good to see some sunshine again! We have been watching Captain Pugwash as our Drawing Club focus which the children have all found funny! The children are all working extremely hard with their writing and we have had some wonderful sentences. In maths we have been counting beyond twenty and thinking about patterns as our numbers get larger. We have enjoyed learning about the seaside and how it was different in the past and it has been great to see all of your wonderful beach photos and facts that you have shared on Tapestry. Ice creams and sandcastles are our favourite seaside activities! We are also really proud of all of the children for their efforts with their first ever sports day, well done to them all!

### Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Year 1 have had another busy and productive week!

In phonics, we have now begun focusing on developing our **reading fluency**, working hard to build both confidence and speed in our reading. The children have enjoyed practising

strategies such as spotting **words within words** (for example, finding “*knit*” inside “*knitting*”) to support their decoding skills.

In English, the children worked incredibly hard to write their own **retell of *Little Red Riding Hood***. They particularly enjoyed exploring an alternative ending where the wolf was kind, showing great creativity in their writing.

In Science, we planted our own **cress seeds** and wrote clear and thoughtful instructions explaining how to care for them. The children are very excited to watch them grow!

In Maths, we have come to the end of our learning on **money**. The children practised recognising coins and notes and have begun to **count money** with increasing confidence.

To finish the week, we had a fantastic **Sports Day** on Friday. The children did a superb job representing their houses, showing great teamwork, determination, and—most importantly—having lots of fun!

Well done, Year 1, on such a brilliant week!

## Owls and Robins

Another busy week in Year 2!

In Literacy, the children have been working hard on their ‘Hot Write’ - a retelling of Grandad’s Island! The children have impressed us with their creativity and use of new vocabulary!

In Maths, the children have continued to look at efficient methods for solving problems.

In Science, lots of fun was had as we started to grow cress! We made predictions about how long it will take to grow and had lots of fun designing our pots!

The children showed lots of enthusiasm in Geography, where we looked closer at the Jurassic Coast!

In PSHE, the children thought about changes in their lives from birth to when they are elderly. The children also looked at our ‘No Outsiders’ text “My World Your World” and considered the lives of children in different countries!

As ever, the children enjoyed taking part in Sports Day and cheering on their houses!

The highlight of the week for many, of course, was our trip to Beeston Castle! The children did a wonderful job representing our school out in public. The children showed lots of enthusiasm whilst exploring the ruins, sketching the castle and creating their own crowns, wands and swords in a Woodland activity! Thank you to the parent helpers who supported with this too!

Keep up the fantastic work Year 2!

## Sandpipers and Moorhens

In Year 3 this week, we have worked incredibly hard on our hot write based on *Into the Forest*. The children have impressed us by including dramatic sentences to build tension, using personification and “show not tell” techniques to bring their writing to life. We are so proud of the creativity and effort they have shown. In maths, we have been exploring parallel, perpendicular, horizontal and vertical lines, using actions to help us understand and remember this new vocabulary. In geography, we compared a map from the 1900s with a current map and were amazed at how much land use has changed, particularly the increase in houses and roads. In French, we have begun creating a picnic story based on different places we might visit on a walk. In music, we have started composing our own ballads by planning a story using the story mountain structure, which will later develop into lyrics to perform. In spelling, we have focused on the prefix *sub* and how it changes word meanings. We also enjoyed a fantastic Sports Day—well done to everyone for showing such great team spirit, whether cheering or competing!

## Kingfishers and Lapwings

In Year 4 this week, we have worked incredibly hard on our invention narratives based on Jacques Cousteau's invention of the Aqualung. The children have enjoyed putting themselves into the shoes of the famous inventor and writing about his experiences and emotions as he tested his groundbreaking invention for the first time. We have been so impressed with the creativity, imagination and enthusiasm shown throughout their writing.

In maths, we have completed our topic on shape. The children have explored the properties of quadrilaterals, learned the names of different triangles and developed their understanding of angles, including acute, obtuse and right angles. They have shown great confidence when applying their knowledge to a range of reasoning and problem-solving activities.

In science, we have continued our learning about sound by investigating how we hear. The children learned about the different parts of the ear and the important role each part plays in helping sound travel to the brain. Ask your child what the hammer or the anvil does—they may surprise you with their scientific knowledge!

In DT, we have started our exciting new project focused on mindfulness and timers. The children have explored what mindfulness is and discussed how timers can be used to support relaxation and focus. Over the coming weeks, they will be designing and creating their own mindfulness timers, bringing together all the skills they learn throughout the project.

We also enjoyed celebrating the achievements of our Year 4 athletes this week. A special well done to all the children who represented the school at Town Sports and to everyone

who took part in Sports Day. We are incredibly proud of the determination, resilience and excellent sportsmanship shown by all of our children.

## Kestrels and Red Kites

We have had such a busy week in Year 5!

In maths, the children have completed a super short unit on negative numbers which they have absolutely smashed! They have shown a great understanding of comparing and finding the difference when using negative numbers.

In literacy, we have completed our hot writes on 'King Kong'. The children have used dialogue to progress the story and have ensured that their paragraphs flow.

In science, we started our topic on materials. The children discussed the differences between solids, liquids and gases. They also described the properties of materials using words such as flexible, durable, magnetic and permeable.

In geography, we have looked at different types of physical features found in deserts such as mushroom rocks. In computing, the children thoroughly enjoyed creating quizzes on Purple Mash. We also enjoyed making Father's Day cards at the end of the week (but shhhhhh, don't let the dads know yet!)

We have had such a busy week with children representing Wheelock at the Debate Mate event, where we came third! We also had many children going to Town Sports last night and being sporting superstars. We are tremendously proud of our children and the efforts they put in both inside and outside of the classroom. Finally, we finished the week with even more sport at Sports Day.

What a fantastic week. The sun made an appearance, and we've seen some amazing work from the children! Have a wonderful weekend - we all deserve a rest!

## Eagles and Hawks

It has been a wonderfully creative week in Year 6! Inspired by the book *The Dot* by Peter H. Reynolds, pupils explored a range of artistic media to produce unique pieces that express their individuality. The results were outstanding, and we are delighted that some of these will be showcased at the annual trust art exhibition.

We have also enjoyed continuing our class reading of *Holes*, discovering more about the characters working hard at Camp Green Lake.

A huge congratulations to all Year 6 pupils who represented the school at Town Sports – you were excellent role models and did us proud. Today's Sports Day was another highlight, with fantastic teamwork on display during what was a memorable final one at primary school. We

are now looking forward to next week, when many pupils will attend their high school transition days – excitement is certainly building for this next chapter!

Regular attendance at free eye tests is essential for supporting the health, learning, and overall development of children across Cheshire East. Many vision difficulties in children are not immediately obvious but can significantly affect reading ability, concentration, behaviour, and participation in the classroom. Routine eye examinations enable early identification and treatment of potential issues, helping to prevent long-term impacts on educational attainment and wellbeing. As NHS-funded eye tests are free for children, schools are encouraged to support and promote regular check-ups as a simple and effective way to help pupils achieve their full potential.
