

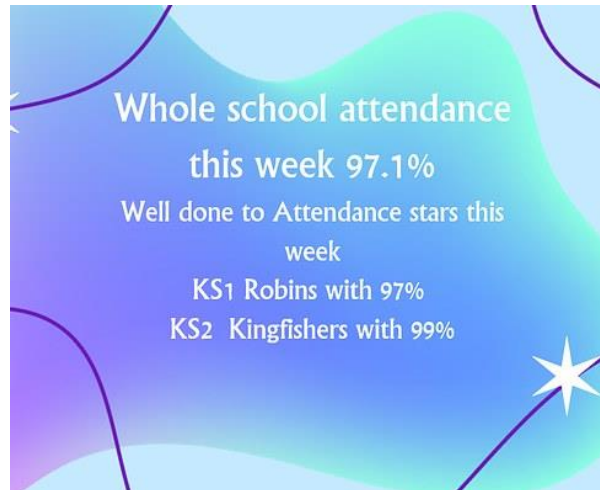

Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

We have had a wonderful week in Reception! In Drawing Club, we have been enjoying the story *The Odd Egg*, which the children absolutely loved. They were very engaged and enjoyed talking about the characters and events in the story - we designed our own eggs, thought about what might be inside them and what we could use to carefully crack them open! We are also focusing lots on our letter formation, making sure we start and finish our letters in the right place.

In Maths, we have been focusing on ordering numbers on a number track and playing fun track games. The children have been practising counting carefully and making sure they do the correct number of jumps each time.

Our topic work has been all about life cycles. We have been learning about the life cycles of a butterfly and a frog, and the children have really enjoyed getting creative by making butterfly wings and frog headbands.

Well done for another super week Pufflings & Cygnets - have a lovely bank holiday weekend!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

In Literacy, we have been completing our hot writes based on our class text *There's a Tiger in the Garden*. The children have been practicing writing clear search sentences and have impressed us with their use of new and adventurous vocabulary.

In Maths, we have been learning how to make equal groups and share amounts. The children are also growing in confidence with counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In History this week, we explored the life of the explorer Matthew Henson and learned about his voyage to the North Pole. The children asked some thoughtful questions about his journey and what life might have been like on his expedition.

During Whole Class Reading, we have been enjoying *The Bee Book*, where we have been learning lots of new vocabulary and finding out about different types of bees and why they are so important. We are very much looking forward to our trip next week to see some bees and consolidate our learning.

We hope you all have a lovely Bank Holiday weekend and that the sunshine continues for everyone to enjoy! 🌻

Owls and Robins

This week, Year 2 have been creating their 'hot write' in English. The children have skilfully retold the story of 'Cyril the Lonely Cloud'.

In Maths, the children finished their unit on Measure by looking at temperature. Now, we have started Fractions! The children have been fantastic at identifying parts/wholes, equal and unequal and finding $\frac{1}{2}$ of a shape! Keep up the good work as we move into quarters ($\frac{1}{4}$) next week!

In Science, we have been talking all about the ways a seed can disperse! Can your child recall any of the 6 ways?

The children were very engaged in History this week where we learned about William the Conqueror by looking at the Bayeux Tapestry!

As well as our Rights Respecting afternoon on Friday - in PSHE the children looked at one of our 'No Outsiders' texts called *Hair, It's A Family Affair!* The children were excellent at explaining what discrimination was and how it linked to our story!

In RE, the children looked at three key aspects of Humanism and in Music they have been looking at the structure of a piece of music about King Arthur!

Keep up the fantastic work, Year 2!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

This week in Literacy, the children explored *mischief narratives*, creating their own imaginative stories using alliteration and similes to bring their writing to life. In History, we learned about Ancient Egypt and investigated hieroglyphs, finishing the lesson by writing our own names in hieroglyphics. During Science, we went outside to explore opaque, transparent and translucent objects and investigated how they affect the shadows they cast. In Maths, we have moved on to money, practising how to add pounds and pence together confidently. In PSHE, the children discussed online safety, learning how to keep themselves safe when using different devices. Finally, in RE, we explored the Hajj pilgrimage, learning about the six stages and thinking carefully about what we would take with us on this important journey. Well done to all the children this week for being absolutely amazing and working so hard!

Kingfishers and Lapwings

We have had a wonderful and busy week of learning in Year 4!

In Literacy, we began by writing a magical list poem inspired by our class text, *Leon and the Place Between*. We then explored a model text, identifying its structure, key language features and the author's craft. Building on this, we developed our use of expanded noun phrases to describe a magical setting, in preparation for writing our own independent setting descriptions.

In Maths, we have been learning about tenths as both fractions and decimals, as well as dividing one- and two-digit numbers by 10 to create decimal numbers. We then moved on to exploring hundredths as fractions and decimals.

Science has been particularly exciting this half term as we begin our electricity topic. This week, we investigated the question: *Will the bulb light up?* The children explored how to create a complete circuit and developed their problem-solving skills by identifying and fixing incomplete circuits.

In History, we are learning about the Anglo-Saxons and have been using artefacts to make thoughtful deductions about how people lived during this time. In French, we have started learning the names of different jungle animals, and in Computing, we have been exploring hardware and software, creating our own informative leaflets to showcase our understanding.

We are very much looking forward to welcoming parents into the classroom and sharing our learning around children's rights—it promises to be a fantastic afternoon!

Kestrels and Red Kites

During maths, Year 5 have concluded their unit on shape and lines. We have successfully identified shapes from different positions by looking at their faces. We have also investigated lines based on known facts such as how many degrees on a straight line.

In literacy, the children have written a persuasive letter from Lady Macbeth to Macbeth. The children have used demanding language as well as flattery to persuade him to murder King Duncan. They have been using modal verbs to show certainty as well as parenthesis and relative clauses.

During History, the children explored Greek gods. We used historical sources to identify the gods based on their human characteristics. We looked at Darwin in RE and how he matches with a humanist belief. In science, we explored how a foetus develops in the womb. We looked at each stage and how the development needs to happen before the foetus is born. In music, we used music lab on the laptops to create loops of music that can be repeated. The children enjoyed creating different tunes. During computing, we are continuing to look at Microsoft Word and how we can insert pictures and move them around a document.

We also enjoyed our RRS afternoon by creating flowers that show our right to education. We discussed how we can be responsible for our education by listening, being ready to learn and being on time for school.

Have a lovely bank holiday weekend - let's hope the sun stays!!!

Eagles and Hawks

Year 6 have enjoyed an active and enriching week of learning.

In **Maths**, the children explored position and direction, working with coordinate grids and experimenting with the reflection and translation of shapes.

In **Literacy**, they planned a firstperson narrative inspired by *Paradise Sands*.

Our **History** lessons focused on the Battle of Britain, where pupils listened to powerful firsthand recollections from RAF personnel.

In **Music**, the class learned a dramatic theme using body percussion and vocal sounds to recreate the textures of an orchestra.

To end the week, Year 6 spent time with their Reception buddies for Rights Respecting School Day, sharing posters they had created and helping younger children learn about their rights.

Be Your Best is a positive, empowering programme that helps children feel calm and confident as they prepare for SATs, the Multiplication Check and other end-of-year assessments. It offers simple strategies to build a positive mindset; ease worries and approach each assessment with self-belief.

Dear parents,
Places are now available to join a new 12-week football course every Monday at The Oaks Academy, which is open to both boys and girls.

Our courses teach children correct football techniques by FA qualified coaches who have full DBS (CRB) clearance to work with children. The structure for the course is 'FUN through Football,' building confidence for total beginners and moving onto more complex sessions for experienced players.

We provide a ball per player for the majority of our drills ensuring children get more touches of the ball and improve quicker than conventional coaching where children are waiting around to have a turn. The sessions are held on the fantastic astroturf pitch so trainers should be worn. Players are also advised to bring a still drink for the session.

The club has links to local junior teams of which players will be able to play for at the weekend. Players who show advanced ability on the course will be recommended for trials at professional academies. Players who have previously attended courses are currently playing for Preston North End, Blackburn Rovers, Manchester United, Liverpool, Blackpool, Everton, Barrow, Bolton, Oldham, Rochdale and Wigan.

The cost of the course is just £6.67 per week, which is payable in two instalments. The first payment of £30 is due when booking your child on and the second payment of £50 due at the first session. Parents are encouraged to watch the sessions but are welcome to leave children, as every session is fully supervised.

NEW TOURNAMENT FORMAT

Every four weeks we have a tournament in order for the children to put their new-found skills into practice with medals awarded at the end of the course for various categories.

ALL PLAYERS WILL RECEIVE A TROPHY AND MEDAL at the presentation, which is held on the final week of the course. Additional trophies will also be awarded in each group from categories including: Best Attitude, Star Player, Most Improved Player, Most Promising Player and Hardest Working Player.
