Class News

Penguins and Puffins

Super work this week everybody! We have been reading our 'No outsiders' text Red Rocket and Rainbow Jelly. The children loved sharing the story and talking about what we like. We discovered that we all like different things and that is ok. We also said that actually, it is great that we are all 'unique'.

In Maths we have been making five in different ways and developing our understanding of the composition of 6,7 and 8.

We have been learning about cold places such as Antarctica and shared our learning about Robert Falcon Scott the polar explorer!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

It has been another busy week in year one this week!

In literacy we have finished our detective narratives and we have been using a purple polishing pen to edit our work. The children are getting good at reading back their work and spotting any errors.

In maths we have been learning new mathematical language like greater, fewer, largest and smallest. We then used these words to compare some numbers to 20.

The children loved whole class read this week as they performed a verse from Chocolate Cake by Michael Rosen. The children focused on changing their tone of voice to show Michael's guilt and mum's confusion which then turned to anger when she realised the chocolate cake was gone!

On Thursday in history, we had a special visitor. Her name was Pearl and she was 82 years old. She came to tell us how she celebrated her birthday when she was younger. The children were shocked when they realised just how different birthdays were in the past to how they are celebrated now.

In computing the children learnt the term 'debugging' and we looked at how to debug an algorithm together. The children then had a go at sequencing an algorithm in the right order and we challenged them to type their own instructions for it.

Owls and Robins

In year 2 this week, we have started to immerse ourselves in the new part of our Bog Baby - a set of instructions. We have received a letter off the Bob Baby Society about us needing to send a set of instructions on how to build a habitat for our own Bog Baby's. We are really excited to start this next week!

We have completed our money unit in maths this week. We have worked really hard on problem solving and giving change. We have also really enjoyed our 'Number Day' and playing lots of number games.

In history, we continued to explore our topic on flight. We became eye-witnesses of the landing after the first flight by a woman across the Atlantic Ocean.

Also this week, we have completed some craft for the whole school display on the Nutcracker and also made our own character for our e-book in computing.

Well done year 2 for a hard-working week.

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have discovered more facts about how light travels and made shadows with light sources and opaque materials in science. Across Waterbirds, the teachers have enjoyed finding out about the secrets of the ancient pyramids and learning about the mummification process in history.

We have been working hard on our hot tasks in literacy, the teachers have been wowed with the amount of progress made by so many since September - excellent work Waterbirds. Year 4's have been continuing to work on multiplication and division in Maths and tackling tricky problems whilst year 3 have been enthusiastically beginning to find out about units of measure.

On top of all of this, we have enjoyed making Egyptian papyrus (paper) to continue our Egyptian art theme and have had fun sticking strips of 'papyrus' together ready for next week hieroglyphics lesson. We have enjoyed the science-based toys at the gadget shop and look forwards to Friday Math's day for the NSPCC! Well done for all your hard work this week Waterbirds!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

During maths this week, year 6 have persevered with their algebra unit. It has been tricky but the new concepts are starting to become clearer. Year 5 have developed their written methods for division.

In literacy, we have started our unit on bargain letters. The children are looking at how to persuade a character to change their mind on a key issue.

During science, the children learnt about natural selection. In computing, they continued to explore micro:bits and how to make them brighter or dimmer. In RE, we learnt about Muslim marriages. During history, the children explored primary and secondary sources linked to the Tudors.

On Friday, we enjoyed number day. The year 6 children enjoyed spending time looking at numbers with their buddies. We played games and completed number puzzles.

This week we said goodbye to Miss Tatler who has been a student teacher in Kestrels. We have all benefitted from her support and we wish her lots of luck as she moves on to her next school placement.


