Our History theme of 'Toys in the Past' has concluded with the children making their own Toy Museum. Our exhibits needed labels - The children did a really good job, using our key vocabulary and remembering all the important facts about the old and new toys. Well done Woodpeckers and Goldfinches.

During science, the children have worked in groups to plan out an investigation which looks at their heart rate in comparison to exercise. In RE, they finished their work on Diwali and Holi.
