Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

A fabulous Christmassy week in Reception. We have been sharing and discussing our favourite Christmas stories. We have moved into our new Phonics groups and have been working so hard on our blending. In Maths, we have been identifying and combining four sided shapes. We have sorted the shapes based on their sides and created Christmas shape pictures. We have been using painting techniques to create calendars and have talked about Christmas traditions from the past. Have a well-earned Christmas break everybody!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Our final week of the term has been a busy one! In whole class Read we have thought about which animal we would prefer to be out of the story 'Oi Frog'. The children had to justify their reasons and write a sentence using the word 'because'. We then performed the story with our talk partners - this was great fun.

In PSHE we have ended our unit which has been all about celebrating our differences. This week we have been thinking about what makes a good friend and we made 'friendship tokens' for people who showed us the qualities of being a good friend.

In Art we have applied our colour mixing skills and painted a paper plate in the style of Clarice Cliff's 'Circle Tree' design. We have been very impressed with the children's attention to detail and how they were able to mix their own colours.

Year 1 thoroughly enjoyed our theatre visit on Wednesday. The sword fighting and dancing were our favourite parts - we hope they have told you all about it. We were so proud at how

they represented Wheelock school using the Wheelock behaviours at all times. Well done Woodpeckers and Goldfinches.



Owls and Robins

What a busy (but brilliant) final week of term Year 2 have had!

This week, the children completed their 'hot write' in Literacy. The children produced diary entries, imagining they had woken up and discovered an elephant topiary in their gardens! We were wowed by the quality of the children's writing and very impressed with their independent editing skills!

The children finished their RE unit which looked at why Christians believe that Jesus was a 'gift from God'. The children produced some thoughtful work which considered: the Christmas story, what gifts Christians believe Jesus gave to the world and how the children could help the world.

There has been lots of 'hands on', tasks that the children have certainly approached with resilience and creativity! In Design Technology, the children explored Ferris Wheels. The children first designed their own Ferris Wheels and then begun looking at creating a working axle, wheel and pods! The children also enjoyed completing a STEM project where they used recyclable materials to make a boat for Santa!

In Science, the children looked at medicines and how these help us to be healthy. The children were excellent at explaining the importance of only taking medicine that is meant

for you and in the right amounts! After this, the children completed a little Science quiz to finish their unit on 'Animals including Humans', showcasing their knowledge of what they had learned this half-term!

In Whole Class Reading, the children looked more at the 'Queen Victoria' book and learned about how the first Christmas Trees arrived in Great Britain, under Victoria's reign! The children used their inference skills to imagine what children thought and how they would have felt having their first ever Christmas tree!

Of course, one of this week's highlights was the theatre visit to watch 'The Three Musketeers'. The children thoroughly enjoyed the lovely performance and their behaviour was fantastic! You should be proud of representing the school in such a wonderful way!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

What a term it has been! Our year 3 children have faced the new challenges of joining KS2 in their stride. In the Hive the children have loved creating their Christmas crafts with Kerry, children from all ages have enjoyed their time with their friends.


In the main hall the children have played board games, spent time sharing stories with the peers and creating pictures based on the Christmas theme.


