Class News

Penguins and Puffins

A super week in Reception this week. We have written our own versions of The Storm Whale. Our teachers are super impressed with our letter formation and super decodable sentences. In Maths we have been recognising and creating repeating patterns with three units. In our topic we have been exploring Africa and have learned about some animals that live in hot countries. We have started to look at different maps and identify land and sea. We have made African rainmakers using a range of materials. We have also explored magnets this week and have sorted items based on whether they are magnetic or not. Outdoors we have been creating some amazing recipes in the outdoor kitchen and have investigated colour mixing in our water area. The children have loved being outside this week and have spotted lots of signs of Summer!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had a wonderful week in Woodpeckers and Goldfinches. In Literacy we have started to write our 'Hunting Narrative'. The children are getting so good at planning each section of the story to help them produce a great piece of writing. It is lovely to see them using everything they have learnt this year in literacy as well as using some interesting vocabulary. Well done everyone.

In Maths we have focused on equal groups - consolidating our counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. It has been fun working out what different groups can be made using a big number. For example: Number 20 can be 4 groups of 5, 2 groups of 10, 5 groups of 4 or 10 groups of 2! Next week we will move onto sharing.

The highlight of our week has to be Wheelock's 50th Birthday celebration. Woodpeckers and Goldfinches have particularly enjoyed our 'Country Dancing' session, making some Elton John style glasses and our Star Wars themed art. We have also watched some Kids TV shows from the 70's and enjoyed some playground games together. Thank you for all your amazing 70's fashion today and for all the sunglasses.

Owls and Robins

What a busy week we have had this week!

At the start of the week, we designed our own invention to write a description and set of instructions on based on our book, 'Rosie Revere Engineer'. We came up with some really imaginative and unique design ideas.

In maths, we have been problem solving. This has been a challenge for us and has tested our maths knowledge and understanding as we have been applying what we been learning over the year.

In science, we looked at hygiene and why it is important. We used glitter to represent germs and then gave everyone a high 5 - we saw how easy it was to pass on these germs. We then learnt how to wash our properly so we could stay healthy. We made a set of instructions for how to wash our hands and added pictures for this too.

At the end of our week we have been celebrating 50 years of Wheelock. We have had so much fun being creative, learning facts about the 70's, watching old TV programmes and completing work linked to this. Well done Year 2 for your effort this week!

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have been creating our own classification charts in science and learning more about the amazing variety of invertebrates in the world around us.

In Literacy, we are writing our invention stories based on the incredible Aqua Lung. We have been learning about world rivers in Geography.

All of us have all really enjoyed the 50th celebrations for Wheelock and have revelled in dressing up and all things 70's such as Star Wars, The Wombles, country dancing and playing marbles! We are all really grateful to Mrs French for sorting out all the materials. Thank you.

This week in maths, year 6 have continued their work on problem solving. They have solved problems with percentages and with decimals. Year 5 have continued their work on decimals. They have looked at decimal addition and subtraction using exchanges.

In literacy, we have been looking at King Kong. The children have been able to explore new vocabulary and generated similes to describe King Kong.

During geography, the children have learnt about different energy sources. They have also looked at renewable and non-renewable sources. During science, they have continued to investigate electrical equipment.

The children thoroughly enjoyed their two 1970s days. They looked amazing in their outfits todaythank you so all of the effort put into making and buying costumes. We have learnt country dancing and graffiti art. They have ordered events on a timeline and decorated sunglasses like Elton John! We've had a wonderful week and even the sun came out....finally!!!!


