Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

This week we have worked super hard in Reception. In Literacy we have learned a new text type of instructions. We read the example text on 'how to trap a wolf' and used the key vocabulary, rehearsing the new words in sentences. We also answered questions about the text and sequenced instructions.

In Maths, we have been learning about doubles and how numbers within 10 can be made up of two equal parts. The children explored this concept using tools like dice, fingers, and visual patterns, and practiced recognising doubles as well as recalling some double facts without needing physical resources. We also focused on sorting objects by different characteristics, which helped the children develop skills to identify similarities and differences. Through working with the Numberblocks, the children began to understand how even numbers can be made from two equal parts.

In our topic, we have been learning about schools in the past. The children explored how schools used to look and how they were different from today. They looked at old-fashioned school equipment, uniforms, and how lessons were taught, comparing them to what we have now. The children also learned about the role of teachers and students in the past and discussed how things like playtime, classrooms and lessons have changed over time.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

It has been a very busy week in Year 1. We have written our own 'Portal Narrative' this week. The children have chosen a character and transported them to an imaginary land. We have been very impressed with the vocabulary that the children have used, especially using the suffixes: ed, ing and est. It has been lovely to read their stories and see how they have used their imaginations. Well done Year 1.

In Maths this week we have explored 'Mass'. Using weighing scales, we have looked at how we know when an object is heavier or lighter - some of us were surprised to work out that something large is not always the heaviest!

We have continued to look at the weather his week in Geography, completing our weather diary and also having a go at being a weather presenter. This was so much fun - we used BBC weather maps and used the compass and weather symbols to describe the weather in the UK's capital cities. See if your child can recall the 4 capital cities.

In RE we have begun to look at the Easter story. We have thought about how we would have welcomed Jesus if he came to visit us and then found out that the people in Jerusalem welcomed him by waving palm branches and shouting 'Hosanna'. We enjoyed making our own palm leaves and role playing the scene in Jerusalem.

Owls and Robins

In Literacy, Year 2 completed their "hot write". Inspired by our text 'Grandads Island', the children produced some exciting return narratives of their own! We are continually impressed by the children's creativity during writing tasks! Can your child retell their return narrative to you?

In Maths, the children completed their topic on 'Multiplication and Division.' The children thought about dividing between 5 and 10 as well as odd / even numbers. Next week, we will be starting our new topic on 'Length & Height!'

We thought ahead to Summer this week in Science, in our topic on 'Seasonal Change'. The children learned more about Summer, talked about their favourite things to do during this season & considered how to be safe and protect themselves from the Sun / overheating. The children had an excellent understanding of this!

In RE, the children learned more about 'The Easter Story'. The children demonstrated their knowledge by working as a team to correctly sequence the story. Then, the children created their own cartoon version of 'The Easter Story'. The children have also looked at symbols of Easter.

We took 'one giant leap for mankind' in History this week and looked at Neil Armstrong's flight to the moon! The children thoroughly enjoyed this learning and engaged very well! Can your child remember any facts about the Moon Landing and/or Neil Armstrong?

In Art, the children looked at the collage Artist 'Romare Bearden'. The children explored Bearden's work, creating an Artist research page which included the children sharing their opinions on it. Can your child share their opinion of Bearden's work with you? Can they describe one of Bearden's collages?

In PSHE, the children have looked at 'Elmer' and the importance of being unique. It was lovely to hear the children's considerate thoughts about difference. The children imagined Elmer was coming and made posters I to welcome Elmer and make them feel like they belonged!

In Computing, the children have been looking at 'binary trees'. The children had lots of fun and were confident 'debugging' a binary tree with a partner - we were impressed by some of the fantastic teamwork we saw during this lesson!

Once again, well done Year 2 - keep up the super work!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

Year 3 have started learning about Mass in maths. They have worked very hard at learning strategies to interpret different intervals on a scale counting in different jumps. In literacy, we have continued our vehicle text 'Seen and not heard', but have now started work towards writing instructions on how to be a mischievous child. We have reminded ourselves how to use imperative verbs to be 'bossy'. In science, we have been exploring transparent, translucent and opaque materials as well as the shadows they create. In geography, the children thoroughly enjoyed listen to Shackleton's journey to Antarctica and plotting his route on a map using four figure grid references. In French, we have continued learning to count to 20 and ask each other how old you are. In PSHE, we have discussed our knowledge on emergency services and how they help us live a safe life. In music, the children have been learning about 4 bar rhythms and keeping a steady beat. Super week of learning year 3.

Kingfishers and Lapwings

This week in year 4 we have been writing our stories about a character who leaves home in search of excitement and adventure but ultimately realises that adventure can be overwhelming so returns home to peace and calm. As mentioned in previous weeks, the writing is based on the story Jemmy Button and the children have produced some really wonderful writing which they are very proud of. They have been publishing and this work will go on display in the school. We are still looking at fractions and have now moved on to how to calculate with them. The children have been working hard but found finding

equivalent fractions tricky. If you want to practice something with them at home, you can ask us for guidance on this. In science, we have been continuing our learning about rocks and have been learning about the 3 main types of rock, sedimentary, metamorphic and igneous. Ask your children if they can explain how they are formed! In computing this week, we have been revisiting safe searching on the internet and in DT we will be finalising our biscuit designs ready to create our own biscuits in the last week of term. In French the children have learnt the numbers to 20 and we have been playing bingo in French. As we are approaching the time table check in June, please could we ask that the children are practising on Times Tables Rock Stars at home particularly the timed tests as working at speed can be tricky.

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in literacy, we have started our next genre-biographies. The children have enjoyed learning more about Shackleton's life. In maths, year 6 have moved on to a shape unit, as have year 5. Area and perimeter of rectangles and squares has been year 5s focus whilst year 6 have found the area of triangles.

In science, we have explored what happens to our bodies during the teenage years. In French, we have been using adjectives to deceive clothes. In geography, the children enjoyed learning about the Great Barrier Reef and the threats to it. In art, we looked at recreating the Front Line image by John Singer Sargent. We did this using freeze frames. During computing, the children continue to enjoy making their own computer games.

Year 5 had a visit from the fire service on Thursday. They talked about fire safety and how to look after themselves in the event of a fire.

We have thoroughly enjoyed the sunshine returning this week. Let's hope it stays for a little bit longer. Have a wonderful weekend everyone
