#### **Class News**

#### Penguins and Puffins

A fabulous week in Reception this week. We have been exploring instructions and looking at different examples of instructions so that we can write our own next week. We have enjoyed playing lots of games following instructions and we enjoyed learning how to trap a wolf to help Little Red.

In Maths we have been exploring doubles and looking at odd and even. We have blown our teachers away with our speedy recall of doubles to ten. In our topic, we have been exploring schools in the past and have created some super splatter art in the style of Jackson Pollock.

#### Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

It has been assessment week in year one this week and we are so proud of how well the children have shown their progress and applied their skills and knowledge in reading and maths.

On Monday we used our recipes that we designed to make our smoothies. We got to drink them at the end and next week we will evaluate them and explain what we would do differently if we could make them again.

In geography we looked at the capital cities of the countries in the UK. We identified daily weather patterns between them and presented a weather forecast to the rest of the class.

It was Science week too this week at Wheelock and in year one we have been making shadow puppets and sand timers. We also looked at pictures and talked about our science trip to the Peak Wildlife Park last week.

#### **Owls and Robins**

We have had a hard-working week this week in Year 2.

On Tuesday, we had a fantastic day at the science museum. We got to explore, experiment and problem solve with lots of different science activities. We had a brilliant time in our challenge workshop too, where we used building blocks to solve challenges such as building a bridge to hold the most beanbags.

We have also been challenging ourselves and showing resilience with completing our quizzes. A big well done to all year 2 for their effort with these.

Also this week, we have been developing our understanding of capacity and volume in maths. We have been working with milli-litres and litres and measuring and comparing them.

In geography, we have created a local map of our local area. We used and made our own symbols to add human and physical features on our journey.

#### Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have been enjoying science week, with learning connected to time; and have discovered air resistance in pendulums and shadows being used to tell the time using sundials! Across Waterbirds, we have continued our learning of fractions in maths and been using maths skills to complete our termly tests.

In Literacy, the children have concentrated well when planning for their hot task based on a twisted tale - The Lost Happy Endings. They have begun writing with passion and creativity using direct speech and other important taught skills. Children have been learning about body movements and skills required for success in invasion games in their PE lessons.

Waterbirds today, have enjoyed dressing in blue for Save Water Day. We have seen a brilliant response across Waterbirds with some amazing entries for the British Science Week Poster competition. Well done for all your effort this week Waterbirds!


Year 5 attended sing fest on Wednesday. They sang beautifully and behaved superbly. It was a much smaller event than young voices but it gave them the opportunity to shine.
