Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

We have had a super week in Reception. We have been writing our own story of The Star in the Jar and have used our phonics to write super captions/sentences. Some of us have even started to use finger spaces! In Maths, we have started to explore equal amounts and have started to spot whether we need more or fewer to make it equal. In our topic, we have been learning all about the differences between night and day and have started to explore the local area. We have been recognising familiar buildings and landmarks in Sandbach. Keep up the great work, Reception!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers


It's been a busy and cold week in Woodpeckers and Goldfinches!

In Literacy we have all planned and written our own escape narrative. The children have created a good character and a bad character and used ideas from 'Rapunzel' to use in their stories. It has been lovely to see the great vocabulary that we have explored, being used in the children's sentences. The children are now working with much more independence - well done everyone.

We had lots of fun in Geography this week where we have been making 'Messy Maps'. It has been great to share the children's Tapestry post about using Google Earth and this has helped them to understand how a map is produced. We received a message from an alien that had landed nearby which was a surprise! We used items from around the classroom to make a map of the classroom to help the alien find his way!

Goldfinches went down to the Woodland on Wednesday and despite the cold, enjoyed exploring the space and learning about the sudden change in weather.

In Art this week we have explored how we can mix primary colours together to make secondary colours. We used plastic shapes, crayons. Acetate sheets, plasticine and paint to find out what colours we could make. Can your child remember the answers?



We have also been practising our songs for the Nativity this week - we have been very impressed how quickly the children are remembering the words and actions. We can't wait to share it with you all.

Owls and Robins

In Whole Class Reading, the children have continued to explore the poem "Where Teachers Keep their Pets". The children have considered the meaning of new vocabulary and have drawn pictures to help them remember what the words mean. The children have also thought about what pet they would have and where they would hide it - there were some fantastic ideas like hiding an axolotl in a bottle!

In RE, the children have been thinking about looking after the world using the 5 R's - reduce, repair, recycle, reuse and respect. The children thought about how some Christians believe the world was created and why it is important to look after it. The children made some creative posters to encourage others to do the same.

In PSHE, the children have been looking at the 'celebrate' module on 'myHappyMind' which encourages the children to celebrate their character and what makes them, them. The children looked at 5 different character strengths and decided which they use most - we agreed with the children that we see so many of them demonstrating "love and kindness" and "teamwork and friendship" in school.

In Computing, the children have continued to learn about Online-Safety - this week using Purple Mash to explore e-mailing.

In History, the children have been comparing school in the past and schools now. The children finished this topic by deciding when they would have rather gone to school (in the past or in the present) and justifying this answer!

The children thoroughly enjoyed Science this week where they were investigating 'do your feet get bigger as you grow?' The children enjoyed gathering the data by using rulers to measure the feet of classmates, teachers and the Year 5/6's! We were surprised by some of the results!

Of course, too, the children have enjoyed accessing the Woodland for some (rather chilly!) Forest School sessions!

We can't wait to see what next week brings!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

We would like to say a huge well done to all of year 3 this week as they have been working extremely hard on their autumn term assessments. They have taken the challenge in their stride with great positive attitudes towards showing what they have learnt. In the afternoons, we conducted an experiment into forces and begun talking about different materials and friction. In geography, we learnt about different types of volcanoes and used Google Earth locate them. In DT, we used our geography knowledge, to begin designing information posters. We continued to learn the days of the week in French and in RE we have been investigating a box full of Christmas related objects and discuss what we know, think and wonder about each one. A fantastic week of work. Well done Year 3!

Kingfishers and Lapwings

We started the week, writing a chant in Literacy to summon a storm, as if we were a magical wizard! We loved writing our chant and re-enacting the character of Prospero from The Tempest. Then, we wrote our own character description, thinking about Prospero's character traits and his personality. In Maths this week, we have been learning all about area, and calculating and comparing areas. Today, we have our end of unit test, to show off our knowledge! In Computing, we are learning all about keeping safe online, so our focus was on Malware. Ask us what Malware is and what 'spam' is! This half term, our focus in music lessons is on Christmas songs, so we are now in the process of learning the twelve days of Christmas, and next week, we will be dancing to this. We cannot wait! In Science, we learnt about thermometers and how to use thermometers to measure the temperature of water from different places around school. We can now, as a class tell you the day of the week in French, and our favourite day is Samedi! The study of volcanoes and tectonic plates has been our area of focus in Geography this half term, and we are adding to that learning this week by thinking about the positives and negatives of living near volcanoes. I promise you, there are actually some positives! Finally, in DT we are now starting to design our book cover and think about our design criteria – ready to start our sewing in the next few weeks.

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week, year 5 have been learning about equivalent fractions and improper / mixed number fractions. Year 6 have learnt about multiplying fractions.

During literacy, we have started to write out flashback narrative. The children are trying hard to write in the present tense and then switch to the past tense- a really tricky skill.

In science, we have learnt about the planets in the solar system. During RE, we discussed how gospels have similarities and differences in the Christmas story. In geography, we focussed on migration whilst in PSHE we looked at name calling.

Thank you for all of the donations for the rainbow raffle. Our hampers will look fantastic!
