Penguins and Puffins

A super week this week. The children have worked so hard. We have been rotating, composing and decomposing shapes this week. We have made some super shape pictures.

In Literacy we have shared the book Mommy, Mama and Me and have written about our own families. In our topic we have had some visitor- caterpillars joined Reception and we can't wait to see them grow into butterflies. We have also explored the life cycle of a frog and have learned a new joining skill with split pins.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Another busy week in year 1 this week!

In literacy we finished writing our diary entries explaining why Black Rock should be saved. The children have done amazingly well with their writing and we are impressed with their purple polishing tool.

In maths we have been looking at capacity and volume. The children have been measuring and comparing different capacities and using their knowledge of numbers to solve capacity word problems.

In whole class read we finally got to watch Fantastic Mr Fox. After watching the film, we had a discussion about it and the children were able to explain the similarities and differences between them. We then had a vote on which one we preferred.

To finish off our history topic on explorers we had a discussion about how significant events and people are remembered if they lived over 100 years ago. The children came up with some fantastic ideas and we looked at some examples. The children then chose an explorer of their choice and designed a coat of arms for them which included 4 significant events from their voyage.

With the phonics check fast approaching we are sending another QR code home with your child. Please scan this and practice at home with them over the holidays.

Owls and Robins

We have had a productive, hard-working week this week in Year 2.

In literacy, we have finished our big story writing.

In PSHE, we have talked about friendships and relationships. The children enjoyed sharing stories about the time they spend with their friends.

In History, we were drawing castles to continue on from last week's lessons on the castles that William the Conqueror built.

Today, we have had a wonderful time modelling clay. We worked really hard making pinch pots and clay tiles using the scorn and slip methods. We can't wait to see what they look like after half term when they have dried.

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have been uncovering the differences between vertebrates and invertebrates and understanding what characteristics these give animals in science. We have begun to tell the time using intervals of minutes and understand when you use past and to when telling the time in maths.

In Literacy, the children have writing some amazingly moving refugee diary entries about escaping from terrible events, we have been blown away by their efforts. We have been using the names of jungle animals in French and writing simple sentences. It has been a bit of a topsy-turvy week due to interviews but all of Waterbirds have done themselves proud.

Everyone is looking forward to a break at half term and hopefully some more sunshine!

A few Housekeeping reminders;




