
## Operation Christmas Child – Shoebox Appeal

## Cygnets and Pufflings

A fabulous week this week to round off a super half term. We have been reading our no outsiders book Hello, Hello and talking about how to include everybody despite our differences. In Maths we have been sharpening our subitising skills and using positional language to describe arrangements of 4. In our topic we have been learning about how people celebrate Halloween and how to stay safe at this time of year. We have also followed instructions to bake 'Boo Biscuits'. They were delicious. Well done for a fabulous half term everybody!

## Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

What a fabulous end to a busy half term in year one!

The children really enjoyed walking to the church on Tuesday for the harvest assembly. All the children behaved really sensibly and they sang beautifully in the church.

In maths we completed our unit on addition and subtraction within 10. The children are getting really confident at recognising the different symbols and understanding number sentences. Please keep practicing this with your child over the half term, there are lots of fun games on 'Topmarks' that they could try.

In literacy we taught the children how the prefix 'un' changes the meaning of adjectives and verbs. The children then had a go at writing sentences using the prefix 'un'.

We completed our first My Happy Mind Unit - meet our brain. The children are now all familiar with team H.A.P. See if your child can practice their happy breathing at home and can they teach you the happy breathing song.

Have a fantastic half term year one, we are so proud of how hard you have all worked!

## Owls and Robins

It's the last week of half-term and Year 2 have continued to impress us!

In Literacy, the children finished writing their letters. We have enjoyed reading the children's creative ideas and seeing their passion for writing continue to grow!

In Maths, the children have been consolidating their knowledge of addition and subtraction. The children have been; adding by making 10 first, adding using a number line, adding 3 1-digit numbers and adding to the next 10!

In Whole Class Reading, the children have completed a book review for "The Proudest Blue" and have started to explore our new text - a poem called "Where The Teachers Keep Their Pets".

In History, the children completed some work for "Black History Month". The children learned about Black Sporting Stars and their achievements.

In RE, we have been thinking all about Harvest! The children thoroughly enjoyed their Harvest Service at Church on Tuesday this week. The children made all of the staff proud with their behaviour walking to/from the Church and during the Service. We were also proud of the children's enthusiasm whilst singing "all things bright & beautiful". Back at school, we learned more about Harvest and being thankful. The children drew something that they were thankful for and wrote about this - there were some incredibly thoughtful responses.

Our Harvest learning continued into our Computing lessons this week where the children used Purple Mash to access a variety of Harvest-related activities - including designing Harvest baskets!

In PSHE, we have been practising mindfulness with "happy breathing" and quiet mindfulness colouring activities.

It's been a wonderful half-term and we are incredibly proud of all that Year 2 have accomplished so far! We hope all the children enjoy the well-earned break and we can't wait to welcome them back on November 3rd!

## Sandpipers and Moorhens

What an amazing end to the first half term in year 3. The children have done an amazing job at throwing themselves into the construction of Iron Man models. They had to plan out their design before creating their real-life models.

They have absolutely loved focusing on the Iron Man Book this half term, and have settled in beautifully to the work. They have produced great writes.

They have made a strong start in their addition and subtraction unit in Maths. We are hoping they continue their learning over half term by accessing Freckle and TTRockstars!

The children enjoyed their trip to the church to learn about harvest and showed off their gorgeous singing voices!

We hope they have a lovely and safe half term. We cannot wait to welcome them back after their well-deserved rest.

## Kingfishers and Lapwings

Year 4 have had a brilliant last week of half term! We have been busy completing our art project, sketching still life compositions and then painting them to show texture and light. In literacy the children have done a fabulous job of writing their persuasive magic show reports and have worked hard to edit and publish their writing. In maths we have continued to focus on addition and subtraction and looked at estimating our answers and problem solving. We have started our Geography unit of work which is all about Volcanoes, the children have started by exploring the layers of the Earth and have created their own representations to show this. We hope you all have a wonderful half term!

## Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

We've made it to the final week of the half term!

This week in maths, year 5 have been looking at factors, multiples and prime numbers. They have worked hard at recalling times tables facts. Year 6 have been looking at mental calculations. They have just started a new unit on fractions. In literacy, we have focussed on SPAG skills of modal verbs and prefixes. In science, we did our end of unit quiz on forces. During D&T, the children used Tinkercad to create a 3D model of their animal monitoring devices. In French, we have learnt how to say what subjects we like and dislike and why.

We have had a fantastic half term- lots of learning and making new friends. We are all ready for a week off. Have a fantastic half term and stay safe if you are trick or treating!


Thank you for your support this week with the change of location due to the Parents evening.
