On Tuesday, Year 5 had a road safety presentation with Cheshire Fire Service. The children discussed how to cross the road safely and how to identify potential dangers on the road. Class News

Penguins and Puffins

A super week this week! In Literacy, we have been identifying the four parts of the story using our story friends and have retold the story with actions. We are also having a real focus on forming our letters accurately so will be re- sending the formation rhymes to support when practising at home.

In Maths, we have been revisiting subitising and practising our speedy recall of doubles. In our topic, we have been looking at plants and trees and the changes through the seasons. We created some super seasonal trees using printing techniques and observational drawings of trees within our school grounds.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Well done Year one, you have worked really hard this week!

In literacy we imagined what it would be like to sail to Black Rock and then we wrote a setting description of our journey. The children used some fantastic vocabulary that they have learnt in our analyse sessions.

In maths we have been continuing to focus on numbers to 50 by adding one more and one less. The children have been using ten frames and part whole models to support them with their counting in tens and ones.

The children are really enjoying this terms history topic on 'explorers'. We looked at some explorers from the past and present in more detail and then chose one to write a fact file on. See if your child can remember the names of any of the explorers that we have been learning about this week.

In whole class read we read some more of Fantastic Mr Fox. We then used the text to help us draw a map to show where Mr and Mrs fox lived.

Woodpeckers really enjoyed their first forest school session on Monday. They made self-portraits using natural materials and enjoyed exploring the woodland and climbing the trees.

It will be Goldfinches turn this next Monday coming so don't forget your outdoor clothing and shoes Goldfinches.

Owls and Robins

We have had a busy week in Year 2 this week.

In literacy, we have started to plan our persuasive letter to the King to ask him to lift the ban off the dark. We came up with some amazing ideas as to why we needed the dark back.

In maths, we have been working really hard on our fraction's knowledge. We have been looking at quarters, halves and thirds.

Also this week, we have been looking at who are monarch is and the coronation ceremony - we were really good at recalling these.

In computing, we have been using 2sequence to create our own music - this has been really fun! For science this week, we have been looking at offspring, naming them for different animals and discovering how different babies grow.

Today, we have had a fantastic walk to visit the library. We got to explore the books there, share some stories and create a bookmark too.

Well done Y2 for a great week!

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have been learning all about the incredible life cycle of flowering plants - including how flying pollinators such as bees are responsible for around 80% of all the crops grown in Europe! We have returned to fractions in maths and are now tackling the tricky process of adding and subtracting fractions.

In Literacy, the children have been planning their own fabulous refugee stories, we have been wowed by their amazing use of language - we are all looking forward to reading their hot tasks next week. We have enjoyed finding out about the history of chocolate and how it was used in ancient times in Mesoamerica. Did you know the Mayan people used to put chilli into hot chocolate and drink it without sugar? They thought it was a gift from the gods!

Waterbirds are learning all about humanism in R.E. and the big bang theory of the beginning of the universe. Well done for all your effort this week Waterbirds - you are smashing it so far this term!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

Another really productive week for UKS2.

In maths, year 5 have focussed on measuring angles using a protractor. They have worked tremendously hard on this super tricky skill. Year 6 have started their statistics unit. They interpreted line graphs and have explored pie charts.

In literacy, we have stated to explore our survival narrative. The children have delved into new vocabulary and started to write descriptive sentences linked to different environments such as jungle and mountainous.

In science, the children learnt who Carl Linnaeus was and how had classified organisms. During PE, we did some sprints until the rain forced us inside to do Just Dance. In RE, we looked at big questions which we have different opinions on. During history, we started our WW2 unit by looking at the causes after WW1.

Year 6 have had lots of booster sessions in preparation for their SATs papers. They are working so incredibly hard.


