Class News

Penguins and Puffins

A great week. We have been writing our superhero stories and have been impressing our teachers with our super sentences. In Maths, we have been ordering numbers to 5 and looking at the staircase pattern. We have been learning all about cold environments as part of our theme and have started to look at explorers. We have also continued with making landscape collages in the style of Megan Coyle. Lots of super work Reception - keep it up!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

It has been a busy week this week. Year one have been amazing and we are super proud of them all. Thank you for your supportive comments on the door, on Tapestry and sent to OFSTED - your comments are so important to us.

In Literacy this week we have been writing our own detective story. We each chose a character and used our story friends to sequence a story. We are so impressed with the progress the children have made in their writing. Well done Woodpeckers and Goldfinches.

In Maths we are now working with numbers to 20. We have been making our own number lines, ensuring our 'teen' numbers are formed correctly and been consolidating our number facts when thinking about 1 more and 1 less. We have used a random number generating wheel and using the number chosen to think about 1 more and 1 less. Have a go at home! -

<u>https://pickerwheel.com/tools/random-number-generator/</u> Next week we will be estimating where certain numbers sit on a number line using our knowledge of the numbers to 20.

We have been using our photographs again in History - focusing on significant events that we celebrate. We have thought about how we each celebrate our birthdays and how these celebrations

form part of our memories. We also thought of other significant events such as Christmas, Easter and bonfire night that we can remember and talk about. Please see our Tapestry post about how you can support us with our History learning next week.

Owls and Robins

In year 2 this week, we have been working really hard on applying our knowledge and understanding of new skills and vocabulary to our hot task. We have designed our own Bog Baby and have written a story about finding them. In maths, we have been exploring money. We have been identifying values, making same values with different coins, and looking at pounds and pence. Also this week, we have continued to explore our history topic on flight. We are really enjoying this topic and learning about significant figures that have developed flight. In music, we have continued our journey around the world. We stopped off in Poland this week and learnt a traditional playground song - we enjoyed joining in with this and adding actions.

Well done Year 2.

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have tested materials to see whether they are translucent, transparent or opaque in science. Across Waterbirds, the teachers have enjoyed the children's responses to coding and using algorithms to program using the make code editor on the Micro:bit website - feel free to try at home.

We have begun to plan for our myth story based on Joe Todd Stanton's book Arthur and the Golden Rope for our hot task. We are continuing to work on multiplication and division in Maths and enthusiastically using our reasoning skills to solve problems. On top of all of this, we have been learning about the great pyramids in ancient Egypt and understand why they were built - we have helped a vizier design a pyramid and looked at all the challenges building a pyramid might bring. Overall, we have had a super week including welcoming our visitors from Ofsted into our classrooms!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

We've had a bit of a busy few days this week!

During maths, year 6 have focussed on algebra. They have been strangely excited to begin this unit and have made a great start. Year 5 have looked at division and using written methods for this method.

In literacy, we have started our hot write character narrative. The children have really tried to use impressive vocabulary in their writing.

During science, we explored how animals have adapted to their environment. In computing, the children continued to use the micro:bits. In history, we have learnt about the wives of Henry VIII. Year 5 had another excellent rugby session whilst year 6 enjoyed(!) another productive booster session.

On Wednesday, we visited the theatre to watch the Nutcracker. It was a fantastic show and the children thoroughly enjoyed themselves. They were captivated by the magic of the theatre.

This week saw OFSTED visit. We couldn't be prouder of the children. They showed what Wheelock is all about and were proud to talk about their learning. Our children amaze us daily but this week they have really shown what superstars they are. Well done Year 5/6- you are wonderful and we are so thankful that we get to spend each day with you all!
