#### Class News

#### Cygnets and Pufflings

We've had another wonderful week of learning in Reception, filled with curiosity, imagination and creativity!

This week in phonics we focused on the sounds d, t, i, n and p. The children have been practising how to say each sound, hear it at the start of words, read it and begin to write it. It has been fantastic to see children spotting these sounds in books and signs around the classroom and starting to use them in their own writing and play.

Our story focus in Drawing Club has been We're Going on a Bear Hunt. The children imagined what the bear might look like and created their own wonderful drawings. They explored new and adventurous vocabulary to describe him and some children even used their new phonics sounds to add labels or write simple words alongside their pictures.

In maths, we have been representing numbers in different ways. The children have shown quantities on their fingers, matched objects to numerals and practised naming numbers confidently. They've also been arranging objects so that they can "see the total at a glance" (subitising) which is helping them to build a strong understanding of numbers and patterns.

As part of our topic learning, we continued to think about our homes and addresses. The children enjoyed looking at Google Earth and spotting how houses look different all over the world. We also practised learning parts of our addresses to help us talk more confidently about where we live and who we live with.

We are so proud of how engaged the children have been this week and how they are growing in independence and confidence every day! Keep up the great work, Reception!

#### Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Year 1 have had another great week and have shown off their fantastic learning. They have shown off some fantastic sentence writing in Literacy when retelling the story of Old Bear. They are doing a great job at thinking about their new phonics learning and applying it to their words.

In Maths, they have finished their unit on 'numbers to 10' and completed their end of unit checks. They showed great progress and impressed the teachers! Next week, we are starting our new unit on partitioning numbers to 10. They are ready for the challenge.

In Science, they looked at the properties of wood and looked at some different objects. They are loving finding different materials in everyday objects. This links nicely with our History. They looked at the difference between older and newer toys, and noticed the difference in the materials they are made of too.

We have started a new book in whole class reading. They are loving the book 'Oi Frog!' and worked hard to find the rhyming words. They also have looked at some retrieval comprehension questions to help their understanding.

We are so proud of how the children handled their very first sports day! It was lovely to watch them compete and most importantly have lots of fun. We hope they enjoy the many more they will have as they go through the school. Thank you to all the adults who came to watch the little superstars \( \frac{1}{2} \)

#### Owls and Robins

It's been a wonderful week in Year 2!

This week, in Literacy the children have been creating setting descriptions for different locations from our story "A river". The children have been using expanded noun phrases, alliteration and suffixes to make their writing exciting!

In Maths, we have been focusing on number lines and comparing numbers within 100. The children are becoming confident explaining how they know a number is 'greater' or 'less' and why.

The children had an egg-cellent time in Science conducting an investigation to see which material would be the best to protect Humpty Dumpty from a fall!

In PSHE, the children thought more about rewards and consequences - deciding which rewards / consequences are appropriate in different situations!

In our Geography lesson we looked at the coldest places on Earth and learned about the North and South Pole. The children especially loved watching clips from 'Frozen Planet'.

In Art, the children explored mark-making, tone and control using different drawing materials!

The children's Woodland session again focused on working in teams to build Baby Bear's chair!

#### Sandpipers and Moorhens

This week in year 3, we have been busy writing out first hot write. The children have used all they have learnt on expanded noun phrases, conjunctions, apostrophes and similes to write fantastic 'Approaching Threat Narratives'. In Maths, we have finished our first unit which has been all about place value. The cohort have impressed in their arithmetic ability. We also have lots of 40/40s in our daily numbersense quizzes! In science, the children applied prior knowledge to start learning about vertebrates and invertebrates and looking at a range of animal skeletons. In art, the children enjoyed practising their shading skills. We really enjoyed playing a detective game in French to practise our greetings. In Re we have explored Muslim prayer at home and in the mosque and had a discussion about the importance of prayer and in history we explored bronze age artefacts and looked at the Amesbury Archer.

## Kingfishers and Lapwings

Year 4 have had another fantastic week of learning, engaging enthusiastically across all subjects. In Computing, pupils developed their coding skills using *if statements* linked to coordinates to move a guard and protect his castle on Purple Mash. In Music, they began playing a walking bassline to *Rock Around the Clock* on glockenspiels, continuing their exploration of Rock & Roll. Science lessons focused on investigating the effects of different liquids on teeth using boiled eggs to simulate enamel; the children observed the results this week and discussed how their findings could influence healthy drink choices. In French, they learnt the days of the week and began using them in simple phrases. PSHE lessons introduced key concepts such as rights, responsibilities, and democracy, encouraging thoughtful discussion. In Art, pupils explored a range of painting techniques—including sponging, brushing, and stippling—to develop texture and effect in their work. Finally, in History, they examined the lives of Victorian children, learning about the types of jobs they undertook and comparing them to their own experiences today.

#### Kestrels and Red Kites

This week, in literacy, we have started to focus on our next writing unit which is a formal log for our mission to the moon. The children have been gathering ideas and creating formal phrases.

In maths, we have completed our second unit on place value. We have rounded up to the nearest 100,000, 10,000, 1,000, 100 and 10. The children have struggled with this concept so they might need some support with their homework this week.

During science, we have other out how long it takes the other planets to orbit the sun and how long their years are. In French, the children learnt how to describe other people. During history, we have created a snakes and ladders game that involved Viking trade routes. In art, we used our printing plates to make backgrounds. The children are continuing to enjoy PE with Mr Sutton- we've been blessed with amazing weather! In spelling, our rule has been ible words. The children have worked well to identify and spell words such as possible, reversible and edible.


Finally, we finished the week with sports day today. It seemed so strange to do a sports day at the beginning of the year. The weather made it feel like July though! We were so proud of the children. They were respectful towards their teammates and showed great kindness too. We hope you enjoyed it as much as we did.

#### Eagles and Hawks

Year 6 have had fun week across the curriculum! On Wednesday and Thursday, Hawks and Eagles received First Aid training, carefully learning new skills for keeping themselves safe. First of all, they learned about what a First Aider does, before receiving hands-on, practical training in a variety of life-saving skills, including how to put someone in the recovery position and begin CPR. Added to this, they learned how to wrap bandages around cuts and wounds, and how to make an effective sling for an arm. Both classes showed great enthusiasm and Sophie (from Ensure First Aid Training) was delighted with how all the children applied themselves.





Away from learning life-saving skills, Year 6 have been working hard in maths, solving problems involving factors, multiples, prime, square and cube numbers. In literacy, we have started to learn more about formal vocabulary choices that an astronaut may make when writing a formal mission log about a trip to the moon – we will use these ideas in our writing over the next couple of weeks. In science, we have begun to investigate our pulse rates and will be conducting an investigation into this next week. In PSHE, we have been thinking

about how to be 'Global Citizens', comparing our lives to others around the world. In music, we have been thinking about dynamics, pitch and tempo based on Fingal's Cave by Mendelssohn, thinking how these different elements represent waves in the music and how a composer may lead people performing the music.

Thank you to all the parents who came to support Year 6 at Sports Day today! We would also like to give a special mention to the House Captains, who worked throughout the day to make Sports Day a success. They were amazing at setting up events for the younger children in Key Stage 1 in the afternoon and we are very proud of how well they have responded to the extra responsibilities they have around the school. Well done, House Captains!



Dear parents,
Places are now available to join a new 12-week football course every Monday at The Oaks Academy,
which is open to both boys and girls.

Our courses teach children correct football techniques by FA qualified coaches who have full DBS (CRB) clearance to work with children. The structure for the course is FUN through Football, building confidence for total beginners and moving onto more complex sessions for experienced players.

We provide a ball per player for the majority of our drills ensuring children get more touches of the ball and improve quicker than conventional coaching where children are waiting around to have a turn. The sessions are held in the fantastic sports hall so trainers should be worn. Players are also advised to bring a still drick for the session.

The club has links to local junior teams of which players will be able to play for at the weekend. Players who show advanced ability on the course will be recommended for trials at professional academies. Players who have previously attended courses are currently playing for Preston North End, Blackburn Rovers, Manchetter United, Liverpool, Blackpool, Everton, Burnley, Bolton, Oldham, Rochdale and Wigan.

The cost of the course is just £6.25 per week, which is payable in two instalments. The first payment of £25 is due when booking your child on and the second payment of £50 due at the first session. Parents are encouraged to watch the sessions but are welcome to juve children, as every session is fully supervised.

\*\*NEW TOURNAMENT FORMAT\*\*

Every four weeks we have a tournament in order for the children to put their new-found skills into practice with medals awarded at the end of the course for various categories.

ALL PLAYERS WILL RECEIVE A TROPHY AND MEDAL at the presentation, which is held on the final week of the course. Additional trophies will also be awarded in each group from categories including. Best Attitude, Star Player, Most Improved Player, Most Promising Player and Hardest Working Player.


