Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

A fabulous week in Reception! We have been learning how to segment and blend cvc words using magnetic boards and have learned how to form the next set of letters in our Phonics and writing sessions. In Maths, we have been exploring measure and pattern. We have learned how to use a balance scale and used new vocabulary of lighter and heavier. We have also explored capacity. In our topic of 'It's good to be me!' we have been looking at homes and have used google earth to find our address. Keep up the great work everybody!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

The children have worked really hard in literacy this week writing their build up bear part of the narrative. They have included key vocabulary to describe how their character fell off the tower.

In maths this week the children were introduced to the part whole model. We then used this model to help us write number sentences.

We have really enjoyed looking at photographs of the children's parents and grandparents favourite toys in history. Next week we will be looking at similarities and differences from toys now and toys from the past.

The children created some lovely art work this week in the style of Kandinsky, Bernal and Bolotowsky. The children experimented with different media and drew around a variety of shapes.

In computing this week, the children all logged on to purple mash independently. We then showed the children how to save their work and then find it in the work folder.

Owls and Robins

This week in Literacy, Year 2 have been gathering lots of ideas for their circular narrative. The children enjoyed exploring their senses and generating descriptive language for each of their locations that will feature in their writing. We have seen some very creative ideas and are excited to read the children's finished pieces next week! In Whole Class Reading, the children have considered the 'authors message' from our first story 'The Invisible'. We were blown away with some of the considerate answers they gave us. The children also completed a book review for 'The Invisible' and

have started to think about our next book - 'The Proudest Blue'. In Maths, the children have been comparing numbers within 100 using mathematical language and symbols < > =. The children have also ordered numbers to 100 and begun practising their counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. In History, the children enjoyed looking at old photographs and registers from our school. The children have also written their burning questions about what school was like in the past! In RE, we have been thinking about Jesus' friendship with Peter - how he forgave him and showed kindness. In PSHE, the children continued to consider positive rewards and consequences and thought about what consequences would be 'fair' in different situations. The children also continued on their 'myHappymind' journey by learning about how their brains work to help them do 'tricky things'. We have been really impressed by the children's continued passion in Music as they learn about rhythm and pulse using instruments. What a great week Year 2 - keep it up!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

We are very proud of year 3 this week as it was their first hot write (extended writing) piece of the academic year. Every day, they worked hard to include all their learning into paragraphs about the Iron Man approaching. We started a new unit in Maths, initially recapping on adding and subtracting 1, 10s and 100s using 3-digit numbers. In History, we become archaeologists looking for clues from a range of artefacts from the Bronze Age. The children loved playing a game of detectives in French, which helped them to practice saying 'what is your name?' and being able to reply. In science, we moved away from learning about the skeleton and started thinking about muscles- how our biceps and triceps work. Finally, year 3 our continuing to enjoy learning the recorders and their time down in Forest school learning about the Stone Age.

Kingfishers and Lapwings

This week in Year 4 we have had another great Forest School session and in history learnt all about how people in the Bronze and Stone Age hunted for food. In Literacy, the children have done an amazing job of completing their narratives with lots of super magical description! In maths we have been rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. Our science experiment came to an end as we revealed what effect different liquids had on the eggs which were equivalent to our teeth. Thank you for those parents who joined for the information evening, information will be added to our website page. Have a great weekend.

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in maths, Year 6 have been revising factors, multiples and prime numbers. The children have been using their multiplication facts to support them. Year 5 have moved on to addition and subtraction. They have been using mental methods to help them calculate quickly.

In literacy, we have been completing our hot writes for our diary entries. The children have been using parenthesis and emotive language as well as trying to get each paragraph to flow from one to the next.

During science, we explored air resistance with paper aeroplanes. In history, we looked at the women's vote and suffragettes whilst in RE we explored different Hindu gods. The children have completed coding lessons in computing and continued to use My Happy Mind to support our

understanding of the brain. Year 6 have been very excited to meet their buddies this week. We are certain they will make excellent role models.

We have had a great week despite the weather turning! The children have their maths homework books and two tasks on spelling shed to complete for homework. The books seem to be popular!! Have a wonderful weekend!
