Keep up the super work, Reception.


## Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Year 1 have really enjoyed their visit to their new classroom and teacher this week. It doesn't seem that long ago since they all started in Year 1, but it is lovely to see all the new friendships and great to see all the progress they have made ready for Year2.

In Literacy this week we have explored more of the story of 'The Last Wolf'. The children have been surprised to find out that the animals discovered by Little Red are the only remaining animals of that type and we have decided that they need to be saved. We have come up with some unusual recipes for food these animals would eat and help them to survive. The children have come up with some great ideas to include in their recipes, for example; big brutal bones, 6 stinky, slimy snails and 5 wiggly worms! Who knew alliteration could be so much fun!

In maths we have begun to look at sharing. We have done lots of practical maths this week - sharing fruit, counters and cubes between different numbers of people. Have a go this weekend at sharing things at home. The children have been excited to discover that not all quantities can be shared equally.


