Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

This week in EYFS, we have been working super hard. In Literacy, we have been practising writing instructions, learning how to clearly describe steps for 'how to trap a wolf'. In Maths, we have been investigating 3D shapes, identifying and naming them, such as cubes, spheres and cones. We also explored their properties and investigated whether you can stack, slide or roll the shapes. During our topic, we have been learning about recycling, we have been learning about the importance of reusing materials to protect the environment. We sorted different types of waste and discussed ways to reduce, reuse, and recycle. This has helped us understand the impact of our actions on the planet and fostered a sense of responsibility toward taking care of the environment. It has been a busy week!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

The children have been busy this week and have enjoyed moving classrooms. Both Goldfinches and Woodpeckers have settled into their new rooms and we are pleased with the children's mature attitude and behaviour towards the change.

In literacy this week the children have been thinking of a name to call their Wild Thing. We started by using a name of one of the Wild Things features and then added a verb with an 'er' suffix on the end. The children came up with some fantastic ideas.

In maths we have been comparing capacity and solving word problems based on mass and capacity. Make sure your child accesses the questions set on freckle to help support their learning.

In computing the children have been using code to make a simple computer programme. They learnt what an object and action is and how to input a command into the computer.

Art was fun this week as the children worked as a class to recreate Louise Bourgeois 'Maman' spider sculpture (1999), the children rolled newspaper to make the spider head, legs and body and next week they will paint him ready to go up on display.

The children enjoyed making Mother's Day cards on Thursday and are looking forward to giving these to their mums. We hope everybody has a wonderful weekend!!

Owls and Robins

Another busy week for Year 2!

In Literacy, the children have turned their focus to informative writing! The children have been inspired to help Grandad write fact-files about different animals, next week. This week, the children have been gaining the knowledge and skills to do this - the children have: looked at a new WAGOLL about Toucans; explored new vocabulary; looked at using formal openers to write sentences about Orangutans and Tortoises; analysed the writing techniques that the WAGOLL author used; used a variety of conjunctions to extend sentences!

In Maths, the children have thoroughly enjoyed starting their new topic 'Length & Height'! The children have been exploring measuring in 'cm' and 'm', before comparing and ordering different lengths/heights. It's been wonderful to see the children's enthusiasm and confidence with this topic! Can your child recall how many cm are in 1m? Can your child explain why 48m is longer than 43m?

Art was very fun (and messy!) this week! The children have worked as a team (across the whole year group) to create textured paper that they will use next week when they create their own Woodland Collages! First, the children had to demonstrate their colour-mixing knowledge and colour-match parts of a Woodland scene. Then, the children had to consider the texture of a Woodland item (e.g. flowers / leaves / wood) and choose a tool to paint that texture with! The children did a fantastic job and we can't wait to see their final collaged-Woodland scenes on Monday afternoon!

In PSHE (No Outsiders) the children continued to use 'Elmer' to think about being unique and celebrating difference. The children thought about what makes them 'unique' and what is important to their identity. After this, the children designed their own elephant to reflect their uniqueness! This links to Article 8 on our 'Rights, Respecting Charter' - everyone has the right to their own identity.

In RE, the children have been thinking about different people they admire and why. The children were able to recognise lots of admirable qualities someone might have and they produced some very considerate work for this.

Finally, this week in Geography the children completed some field-work, looking at what is wonderful about our local habitat (the school field! Lots of fun was had as we headed outside in the Thursday afternoon sunshine, where the children created tally-charts of different plants / animals they saw before recording this data on a bar-chart. After this, we thought about the importance of looking after our local area and the children created posters about this!

Well done Year 2!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed their literacy unit this half term. This week they have been writing their own instructions on how to be a mischievous child. Year 3 used a range of noun

phrases, word families and imperative verbs to instruct. In Maths, year 3 achieved superbly in their end of unit check on Mass, and they have made a great start to learning about Capacity. In science, we picked a great week to be learning about changes to our shadow. The children created their own investigation to explore how the distance of the light source can impact the length of the shadow. Because of the sunny weather, the children were treated to some free time to explore their own shadows on the playground. In French, the children have been reviewing this term's learning and beginning to have greeting based conversations in the French. In Music, the children have enjoyed testing each other on different 4 beat rhythms, and we have started to learn how to use crotchet and quaver notations. Finally, we were also lucky enough to have a visit from the church this week to help our learning on Easter in RE.

Kingfishers and Lapwings

We have had a wonderful week in Year 4. We received a letter from Jemmy Button to Mama Button in Literacy, so we have been unpicking and learning new vocabulary to access the text, and then we have written a diary entry to detail all of Jemmy Buttons exciting adventures in the city. I especially liked using our 'show not tell' skill to describe ice-cream! No surprise, the whole class were brilliant at this!

In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting fractions and using our new knowledge to solve two step problems. We have also completed our 6 times tables in Numbersense and started learning and practising our 7's and 8's. We will then have learned all of our 36 multiplication facts, so we are hard at work practising on Times Table Rock Stars ahead of the MTC test at the end of May. Our Year 4 Lapwings vs Kingfishers competitions are really helping us consolidate our learning. Who will win this week?

In computing, we have been using google to 'search effectively' on the internet and answer questions about the weather, football teams and capital cities. In PSHE we have talked about the impact of smoking, vaping and drinking alcohol and discussed the impact of peer pressure. In RE we have learned the Easter story and we are thinking about how Christians forgive others, and if we can practise our skill of forgiving.

Thank you to everyone who completed our geography data collection. We used the data to help us understand how families used our local green spaces/parks and have represented our findings in tally charts and bar graphs. In Science, we have learnt about our Earth and the different layers of the Earth. Ask us what the mantle is, and to name the different layers of soil, down to bedrock.

In PE, we have continued to learn how to play hockey. This week we practised an Indian dribble, and we played a game of hockey! Next week, we will be finishing our DT project of 'adapting a recipe', so hopefully some delicious treats will make it home to you all!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week, in maths, year 5 have moved on to look at graphs and data. Year 6 have been refining their arithmetic skills and been looking at volume of shapes.

In literacy, we have been trying to write biographical sentences in preparation for our hot write next week. The children have enjoyed learning about Shackleton.

During science, we have learnt what happens to us as we get older. We looked at fitness, illness and teeth. We shared some funny stories about false teeth and grandparents!

In geography, we have learnt how our oceans are suffering and how we are impacted because of these. In art, we looked at the abstract art of Fiona Rae. The children attempted to recreate her style. In computing, they have been developing their own multi-layered games on purple mash. During French, we have learnt about costumes for carnivals. The children know how to say I wear. Finally, in RE we looked at the betrayals towards Jesus in the Easter story. We asked how we would feel being betrayed by own friends.

A really busy week but really enjoyable. The children are producing some excellent pieces of work- well done. Have a great weekend.

DROP-IN WITH THE EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY TEAM



The Educational Psychology (EP) Service is offering parent/carer drop-in sessions at Cheshire East Family Hubs, held once per half term in both the North and South localities. These informal sessions are an opportunity to discuss concerns, seek advice, and explore strategies to support your child. They are not for Local Authority processes (e.g., EHCPs or placement changes) or child assessments.

Examples of topics include:

- Concerns about speech development
- Managing challenging behaviours
- Social skills or play difficulties
- Anxiety or school-related issues
- Preparing for adulthood

Parents/carers can book a 30-minute slot by calling their local Family Hub. Sessions will be themed based on age groups (e.g., Start for Life, Primary, Secondary/Post-16) to align with the Family Hub journey map. Afternoon sessions will coincide with the Little Stars stay-and-play group for children with SEN.
