Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

A great week this week, Reception. We have been learning about the structure and language in a lost poster and have learned lots of new vocabulary. The little star was very brittle and we loved using this new word in our oral sentences. We have been making predictions about where the star might be and have started to write captions. We are trying really hard to use spaces between our words. In Maths, we have been exploring parts and wholes in lots of fun ways. We chopped up our fruit and looked at different puzzles. We know that wholes are made up of parts. In our topic we have been exploring landmarks in Sandbach and drawing simple maps of Sandbach.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have been busy practicing our songs this week for our nativity on Tuesday, the children are excited to share with you their wonderful singing voices.

In literacy we have completed our fairytale narratives and used our purple polishing pens to edit our mistakes. We have also been practicing our sentence accuracy and handwriting lots this week.

In maths we have been using number lines to 10 to find where the number 5 goes when there are missing numbers. We have also been making different numbers on our ten frames.

In the woodland this week the children made boats out of natural resources found on the ground. We then tested our boats to see if they floated or sank.

In computing the children really enjoyed following an algorithm to paint a picture.

In art we applied our knowledge of mixing colours to paint a picture in the style of Jasper Johns 'color by numbers'.

Owls and Robins

What a wonderful week!

This week in Literacy, the children have been focusing on their SPAG skills. The children have been: using apostrophes to show possession, using the past tense, generating noun phrases to describe, learning about contractions and up-levelling sentences using different sentence openers!

We can't wait to see how the children apply their knowledge to their 'hot task' next week!

In whole-class reading, the children have been using their inference skills to consider why people have pets. The children have also used their retrieval skills to answer questions about the poem!

In Maths, the children have spent the week focusing on subtracting using number lines and have started to consider different methods to 'find the difference' between two numbers. The learning has been tricky at times but the children have shown great resilience! It has also been an exciting week for Maths with the launch of "Numbots"! We are thrilled to see how engaged and motivated the children have been with the new programme and are confident it is going to have a positive impact on the children's number sense!

The children had great fun this week in Science, where they learned about exercise and the impact it has on our bodies. The children learned to find their pulse and investigated how different exercises increased this!

In PSHE, the children have been thinking about their differences. We looked at the 'No Outsiders' text - "Can I join your club?" to support our learning. The children thought about the differences that made themselves and a friend unique. We also considered stereotypes by looking at different duvet covers - the children had some incredibly thoughtful ideas about this.

In Music, the Christmas song practice has continued! The children have been using percussion instruments and sign-language to enhance their performances.

The children spent time learning more about 'Internet Safety' in Computing. The children looked at a Purple Mash profile and discussed all the different things you can learn about someone based on what they write / share or post.

Again, the children thoroughly enjoyed their Woodland session which linked to their D&T work. The children used paper to make a chair for Baby-Bear - they were great at making sure the chair was - strong, stable and stiff!

Well done Year 2 - another super week!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

A fabulous week in year 3 this week.

They have completed their hot writes of a setting narrative about a waterfall. They have used fabulous, descriptive language and really thought about following the river on its journey.

We have been practicing their 3 and 4 times tables and have continued this practise on TTRockstars. Please could the children continue to practise these at home.

In Geography, the children have been really invested in the topic of volcanoes. We talked about the positives and negatives of living near a volcano and had a debate with different children having different opinions.

In French, the children looked at the months of the year and decorated each month with the seasons.

We have started practise for our Christmas carol concert and are sounded beautiful already!!

Kingfishers and Lapwings

Well what a busy week Year 4 have had! We are extremely proud of the positive attitudes that the children have shown towards their termly assessments so a huge well done to all of them! In literacy the children have completed writing their summoning narrative based on the text The Tempest. In geography this week we created our own volcano and designed buildings made of spaghetti and marshmallows that could withstand an earthquake - some more successful than others! In science we have investigated the time taken for chocolate to melt in different circumstances and discussed our findings. Finally, in RE, we were very lucky to have a visitor from the church to talk about the meanings behind the symbols within the Christmas story. Have a great weekend everyone!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week, Year 5 and 6 have spent the week completing their autumn term assessments. They have worked tremendously hard and have demonstrated what they have learnt so far this year.

During science, we looked at how we know that the Earth is spherical and not flat. In art, we learnt about Christmas graffiti. In PSHE, the children discussed direct and indirect bullying. We looked at climate change during Geography by working in groups to learn about what we can do to help prevent it.

On Friday, we were fortunate to be visited by the church. They helped us to discuss our enquiry question: Is the Christmas story true? The children were respectful and showed super understanding.

Year 6 also visited Crewe Alex for Crucial Crew. We looked at electrical safety, vaping, railway safety and what beer goggles are like!!! The children thoroughly enjoyed this!!
