
Reading Ambassadors Recommendations!

Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

A fabulous week in Reception. We have been working hard in Maths. We have represented numbers in different ways on a die frame. We have also been representing numbers 6, 7 and 8 using the 5 'and a bit' structure. In Literacy, we have been learning how to write a letter. We have planned our letter to Joop from our key story Juniper Jupiter. In our topic we have taken part in the Great Garden Birdwatch. We have learned all about birds and have talked about their habitats. We have used key vocabulary such as wing, beak and feathers. We have been birdwatching with binoculars and have recorded our findings. What a busy week. Keep up the super reading at home everybody - well done!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

It's been a busy week in Woodpeckers and Goldfinches. In literacy the children have 'purple polished' their detective narrative. It has been lovely for the children to hear their story been read and they are now beginning to spot their own errors. We have focused on correcting spellings of common exception words and punctuation this half term,

In maths we have been consolidating our learning of numbers up to 20. We have been estimating where numbers are on the numberline and making sure we write our numerals the correct way. We have started looking at doubles and near doubles to help us with calculations. 1. Recall and use doubles of all numbers to 10 (Y1)

In History we have been exploring how celebrations feature strongly in our memories. We have talked about how we celebrate our birthdays - party, balloons, cake, cards, presents etc. We will be comparing this to birthdays in the past. Please let us know if there is a grandparent that could help us with this.

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Owls and Robins

Another wonderful week in Year 2!

In Literacy, the children completed their "hot write". The children have written some fantastic 'finding narratives' where they discovered an imaginary creature. We have been especially impressed by the children's enthusiasm and editing skills!

In Maths, the children have continued to demonstrate their excellent understanding of money. The children have been learning how to: select the correct notes/coins, making values in different ways, comparing values & adding values too! Can your child correctly identify different notes / coins? NumBots continues to be a big-hit with the children and we are thrilled to see the children aspire and challenge themselves to complete the different levels!

Lots of fun was had in Science this week where the children explored the school-grounds to find habitats and microhabitats. The children thoroughly enjoyed finding different minibeasts and were great at explaining why they were suited to their microhabitats. Can your child recall why woodlice are often found under logs?

In Geography, the children have been busy learning about amazing places around the world. The children used Google Maps to locate the continents of famous places such as Mount Etna and the Great Pyramids of Giza!

In RE, the children have continued their learning about the Islamic faith. This week the children have learned about the different ways in which Muslims show respect to Allah.

In PSHE the children thoughtfully engaged in their second "appreciation" lesson in myHappyMind. As well as this, the children thought more about "dreams and goals". In teams, they had a goal to be able to learn and recite a poem by the end of the lesson – we loved seeing the children's confidence during this session and they were very reflective on what went well / what they could do better next time!

Keep it up Year 2!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

Year 3 have continued enjoying their swimming lessons and are making great progress. In literacy we have started looking into how to write a letter and the genre features. We have started our new maths unit on Length and the children enjoyed measuring wingspan with

metre sticks. We've researched why the Roman army were so successful in our history lessons. In science, we have learnt about igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary rocks. We have continued learning all about gratitude in my happy mind and showing kindness and generosity to others.

Kingfishers and Lapwings

We have already reached another weekend! Year 4 have continued to enjoy their swimming sessions and we have seen some incredible progress in their confidence and ability. In maths this week the children have been focusing on division and have learnt methods to divide 2-digit numbers and numbers with remainders. In literacy the children have researched and gathered information about waterfalls as this will be the focus of their information leaflet that they will begin to write next week. In science the children worked in groups to explore whether different materials are conductors or insulators within the classroom. The children are enjoying our current art unit and have been busy sculpting soap using a range of tools into different types of fish. Yet another busy week! Have a lovely weekend everyone.

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in maths, year 6 completed an arithmetic paper. We wanted to identify any gaps in their learning. Year 5 have looked at fractions of amounts and multiplying fractions.

In literacy, we have been writing paragraphs in explanation texts. The children have used information to write factually.

In science, we have learnt about plant reproduction. During history, the children learnt about Athens and Sparta. They decided where they would prefer to live. In RE, we discussed fatso g and how this shows commitment. In PSHE, the children have identified what jobs they would like to do when they are older.

Year 5 had a fantastic singfest rehearsal on Tuesday afternoon. The children were noted for their enthusiasm and hard work. They were also commended on their behaviour- well done year 5! Year 6 had an afternoon in the woods where they continued to work on their bridges structure.
