Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

A super end to a busy term this week. We have been reading the text 'You Choose' to help us understand that we all like different things. We have shared our ideas about our likes and dislikes. In Maths we have been exploring more complex patterns and creating our own patterns. In our topic we have been learning all about Easter and how people celebrate Easter. We have taken part in lots of Easter activities.

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

What a great end to our Spring Term in Year 1.

In Literacy we have all written a character description for a monster. We have described what it looked like, how it moved, what it likes to eat and even added a surprising fact! We are so proud of all the children as they have become so much more independent. They have used some great adjectives and verbs and it has been lovely to see some suffixes used to enhance their sentences. Well done Year 1.

In Maths we have revisited our 'teen' numbers and focused on composition using our rekenreks and 'part whole models'. We have also been describing the position of these numbers on a numberline.

Our 'Wild Things' themed Friday began with watching the movie that was enjoyed by all. We had a discussion about the similarities and differences between the book and film which was very interesting. In the afternoon we enjoyed time in the woodland together. Our Rumpus was made of games and free play and ended with an Easter treasure hunt. We hope the children enjoy the small treats that they received for completing the hunt.

Have a super Easter break. It looks like the weather is going to be kind.

Owls and Robins

The final week of half-term is here & it's been a wonderful one!

In Literacy, the children have outdone themselves with their non-fiction 'Hot Write'. The children have researched and written fact-files on an animal. The children did a wonderful job describing their animals' appearance, habitat and diet. We were impressed by the children's use of question openers (e.g Did you know...?) when writing their fascinating animal facts too!

In Maths, the focus has been Measure! The children finished their topic on length & height and began thinking about mass!

Science saw our last lesson on 'seasonal change' where the children focused on Autumn. After learning more about the weather, trees and animals in Autumn, the children wrote post-cards describing what Autumn in the UK is like! The children had great knowledge of this season & drew some beautiful Autumnal scenes for the front of their postcard, which showed their understanding!

Monday's Art lesson (as predicted!) was very fun but messy. The children collaged a woodland scene, using different materials - including the textured paper they made last week. The children showed lots of consideration and creativity during this lesson!

It was the last Music lesson of the "All Around the World" topic this week, where the children thought back to the different songs they had learned over the half-term! Can your child name any of the countries they have learned songs from or even sing any of the songs to you?

We have spent lots of time this week on our Cooking & Nutrition topic in DT. We started our learning by revisiting a balanced diet and looking closer at the different food groups. Then, the children learned how to safely use a variety of kitchen tools before prepping ingredients ready for their wrap making in the afternoon! The children tasted different food combinations and had lots of fun!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

This week, year 3 have completed their maths unit on capacity and have achieved very well in their end of unit tests. In literacy, we have been focusing on spellings all week. As it is the summer term soon, we are working really hard on securing all common misconception words for year 1, 2 and 3. In science, the children really enjoyed playing with mirrors to secure their knowledge on reflection and linking this to symmetry. To complete our music unit, year 3 have been applying their 'nut/berry' rhythm knowledge to tuned percussion instruments. In geography, we completed our unit through creating our own expedition around the school. the children applied their French vocabulary on animals to Easter hunt games. Year 3 have been very excited to finally get into the kitchen and make their healthy tart that they have been planning and researching this half term. I hope you all enjoyed a piece at home. We would like to say a massive well done to all year 3 for a fantastic term of learning. Have a brilliant holiday and we look forward to seeing you refreshed for the summer term!

Kingfishers and Lapwings

This week has all been about biscuits. It was finally the week we were able to bake and most importantly sample our biscuit designs. We are sorry if they did not make it home but they were just too delicious to save. The children worked very hard and so did our wonderful team of adults. In literacy this week we have been continuing with Jemmy Button and we have written letters home from the big city telling Jemmy's family about all of our experiences. The children have been practising using noun phrases and when adverbials as well as learning the format of a letter. In maths, we have moved onto decimals and have been looking at how they relate to fractions particularly focusing on tenths. In French we have been continuing to learn the numbers and have learnt how to ask and say how old we are. This week in science we completed a science investigation to see which type of soil is most permeable. Test your children to find out what that means and ask what the results were. We wanted to thank the children for all their hard work this term and thank you for being so friendly and supportive to the new adults in Kingfishers. We have a very exciting half term after Easter but we hope you have a lovely two weeks and that the sun stays shining.

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week, in maths, year 5 have completed their unit on graphs and tables. They have worked hard to interpret different information. Year 6 have spent the week completing mock SATS in preparation for May. During literacy, the children have finished their hot write biographies on Ernest Shackleton. They have written four paragraphs which detail his life and achievements. The children have focused on using parenthesis and relative clauses to help add additional information.

In science, we have completed our end of unit quizzes for our animals and human unit. The children have demonstrated some excellent learning during this topic. In art, we explored how pictures can convey different messages. In computing, the children finished their games on purple mash. They had great fun testing each other's games. During geography, we explored how we can help to look after the ocean and what is our responsibility when we visit the beach. We have finished the unit in RE which focused on the Easter story. The children discussed whether what happened to Jesus was part of God's plan or a consequence of events during Holy Week. In French, the children enjoyed designing fancy dress costumes and describing them. We have thoroughly enjoyed this unit of work.

We have had an excellent term. The children have worked tremendously hard, and their work has been of a really high standard. We hope that you all have a wonderful Easter - fingers crossed we get some of this glorious weather that we have been experiencing this week. See you all in two weeks for the final term of the year!
