## Class News

### Cygnets and Pufflings

What a wonderful week we've had in Reception! We've been diving deep into the magical world of poetry through a beautiful poem all about a whale. The children have really enjoyed immersing themselves in the rhythm and language of the poem, using their imaginations to explore the sights and sounds of the sea. Inspired by the poem, the children have had a go at writing their own poetic sentences — full of exciting words, whale wonders,

and ocean adventures. We're so proud of their creativity! In Maths, we've been focusing on equal amounts and exploring the concept of doubling. The children have used practical resources to investigate doubles up to 10, discovering patterns and using real-life objects to build their understanding. "Double 3 is 6!" has been a popular chant in class! Our topic work took us to the seaside this week, as we explored what it's like now and how it has changed over time. The children have been comparing old and new photographs, talking about how people used to dress, what they did for fun, and how transport and beach huts have changed. There were lots of thoughtful observations and curious questions!

We're so impressed with how engaged and enthusiastic the children have been — they are developing as thoughtful learners, confident speakers, and imaginative writers every single day. Well done, Reception!

## Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

In literacy this week we have started to look at recipes. It has been fun to use bossy verbs to write instructions to make a wolf cake. We put our bossy verbs with a great adjective and wrote some amazing sentences. Well done woodpeckers and goldfinches.

In geography we have continued to explore what it is like to live in China. We have looked at lots of images and discovered that China is full of both human features and physical features. We have then designed our own postcards and written a simple letter to tell someone what we saw in China.

In art, the children took on the challenge of weaving using coloured paper to make a chequered pattern. We are really excited to use our weaving looms next week where we will be able to add all the different fabric techniques that we have looked at over the last few weeks.

## Owls and Robins

This week in Literacy, the children have completed their 'Hot Write' and have written their own invention narratives!

In Maths, the children have practised column subtraction and have been telling the time to quarter-past & quarter-to the hour. We have been very impressed with the children's resilience with this topic!

In Science, the children have started to create their own 'lift the flap' book to showcase their understanding of plants!

In RE, the children learned more about a synagogue and what Jewish people might do there.

In PSHE, as part of our topic 'Changing Me' we had a discussion about our body parts. The children also thought about touch - what touch they do / don't like.

Computing was very noisy this week! The children have started exploring the tool "2 sequence" on Purple Mash to create Music. The children were enthusiastic and inspired - especially following last weeks' Music Day!

## Sandpipers and Moorhens

Year 3 have been working extremely hard this week to complete their end of year assessments. We are so proud of all the children. They all approached the assessments with confidence and determination. The progress they have made this year has been fantastic. In literacy, we continued to learn more about how to write a newspaper report ready for next week's last hot write of year 3. In maths, we finished looking at shapes and have started learning about statistics. In Science, the children enjoyed learning about seed dispersal, especially about how animals can eat and excrete seeds- this led to some giggles! In computing, the children have been busy learning how to create PowerPoint presentations. In DT, we have been creating a design brief for our wearable technology and started to learn how to code micro:bits. In French, we have learnt how to say where we live and explored different towns and cities of France.

## Kingfishers and Lapwings

This week in Maths we continued our topic of Geometry, learning about Polygons, and applying our knowledge of angles to the interior angles of polygons. We also learnt about symmetry and will be continuing with this next week. In Literacy, we are learning all about newspaper reports and how we would report on the story of Dad going missing in 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne. We have thought about how to write a newspaper article, thinking about the 5 W's - who, when, what, where and why.

In Science, we conducted an investigation into the pitch of different instruments and how sound was affected by the size of some instruments (such as boom whackers). In Music, we are learning to play a walking baseline to accompany 'Rock around the Clock' and in Computing we were thinking critically about how AI could change our future., in terms of education, medicine and transport. We are loving our French learning at the moment, as we are learning how to say where we live. In Geography, we have learnt all about Fair Trade products and what logo to look for on packaging, and the reasons that fair trade is a very important co-operative and how it works to better the lives of people in different countries around the world.

This week we have also completed all of the NFER papers for Summer with the children. We want to say a HUGE well done to all of Year 4, for working so hard to complete their papers and we are very proud of the progress that they have all made, as the results are very good!

## Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week, year 6 have really stepped up their rehearsal practice. They've been singing, dancing and performing. We are really impressed with their efforts towards the leaver's assembly. They've also been busy painting and preparing for the summer fair next week. They are excited to run their enterprise stalls.

Year 5 have also been working hard with maths and literacy. In maths, we started to look at converting measures. They looked at metric and imperial measures. In literacy, we have planned our hot write based on Greta and the Giants. We are ready to start writing this next week.

In science, we completed our materials unit of work. We investigated reversible and irreversible changes. The children enjoyed creating album covers in art by using photography. We have identified how Christian's show commitment to God through prayer and religious events in RE. During French, the children wrote about the beach and getting people to visit the beach.

On Monday, we were fortunate to be invited to watch Alice in Wonderland at the girl's school. It was the hottest day to walk and possibly the hottest hall in history, but the children were magnificent. We enjoyed seeing past students perform. Hopefully it has inspired some of our girls to join in the annual performance next year!

We've had another great week- really busy but super productive. Well done all! Have a lovely weekend! Two weeks to go!

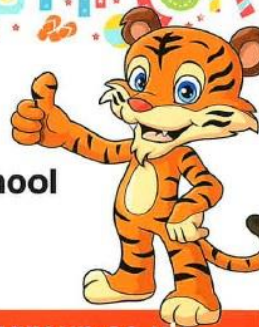

## DROP-IN WITH THE EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY TEAM



The Educational Psychology (EP) Service is offering parent/carer drop-in sessions at Cheshire East Family Hubs, held once per half term in both the North and South localities. These informal sessions are an opportunity to discuss concerns, seek advice, and explore strategies to support your child. They are not for Local Authority processes (e.g., EHCs or placement changes) or child assessments.

Examples of topics include:

- Concerns about speech development
- Managing challenging behaviours
- Social skills or play difficulties
- Anxiety or school-related issues
- Preparing for adulthood

Parents/carers can book a 30-minute slot by calling their local Family Hub. Sessions will be themed based on age groups (e.g., Start for Life, Primary, Secondary/Post-16) to align with the Family Hub journey map. Afternoon sessions will coincide with the Little Stars stay-and-play group for children with SEN.
