# Cygnets and Pufflings

A great week in Reception. In Maths, we have been subitising to 3. We are super speedy with showing our flash fingers now and can recognise how many speedily up to 3 objects. In Literacy, we have learned f,e,l,h and have practised forming them using our Read Write Inc rhymes. We have also been building words using the magnetic boards and some of us are reading our phonics green words. We can't wait to start in our new Phonics groups to show off our super reading. In our topic, we have been learning about the People that help us. We had a visit from the police and learned about how they help people in the community. Keep up the great work, Reception!

# Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had a great week in Goldfinches and Woodpeckers. We have continued writing our story about Old Bear stuck in the attic. We came upon a problem this week where the toys had to climb a plant to try and get him down. We have been impressed with the children using wonderful vocabulary to describe what happened to the plant.

In Maths this week we have completed our unit on Number Sentences. We have been using our ten frames and part, whole models to support our understanding of number bonds to 10. A great video to watch to support recall of these number bonds

In Art this week we have done some observational drawing of pumpkins. The children were surprised to see the different sorts of pumpkins and we have been really impressed with the lovely line drawings that the children have produced. Well done Woodpeckers and Goldfinches.

We couldn't be prouder of all the children this week - thank you for returning the 'Proud tickets' for our PSHE display. It has been great to share why we are proud of each and everyone one in Year 1.

#### Owls and Robins

We were very lucky to start this week with a visit from some of our local PCOS! The PCSO's talked with the children about being safe - online, in school, and when they are out in public. The children particularly impressed us with their understanding of strangers.

In Literacy, the children have finished writing their circular-narratives based on our story "A River". The children really have worked well to include lots of their new learning in their writing - we have been wowed by their use of alliteration and the creative expanded-noun phrases they have used to describe different settings. It has been wonderful to see the children demonstrating thoughtfulness and resilience when editing their work, too!

We feel we may have some budding authors in our midst!

In Maths, the children have been busy enthusiastically counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s! It would be fantastic for the children to continue practising this at home too using the QR codes that they have been given! The children have now finished their first Maths topic of the year and have started to look at our next topic - Addition & Subtraction!

In Science, the children did an egg-cellent job investigating which material would make the best fall-proof coat for Humpty Dumpty! We've never seen so much enthusiasm and excitement over eggs!

In Whole Class Reading, the children have practised many of the 'VIPER' reading strands for our new story "The Proudest Blue". The children explored the meaning of the word 'proud' - relating this both to the main character from our story and a time in their own lives when they felt proud. The children demonstrated their inference skills by carefully considering how our main character, Asiya, felt when she was pointed and laughed at for wearing her Hijab and how she might then react to this.

In PSHE, the children completed a 'No Oustiders' lesson and compared the similarities and differences between families. The children talked about every family being unique and how amazing that is! We thought it was especially lovely that the children pointed out that the biggest similarity in all families was 'love'.

In 'myHappymind' the children continued learning about the different parts of their brain - 'Team H-AP'. We talked about what happens when 'Team H-A-P' don't work together when we are unhappy, angry or scared. We discussed 'fight, flight or freeze' and how deep-breathing can help 'Team H-A-P' to work again!

In RE, the children have been reflecting on their learning about "kindness" from over the past few weeks. We re-visited each of the Bible stories that have underpinned our discussions - 'The Good Samaritan', 'The Tax Collector' and 'Peter Denies Jesus'. Then, the children have decided 'if it was possible to be kind to everybody all of the time' and have justified their answers using these stories

and their own experiences. Following this, the children made an acrostic poem about kindness called "Our Kindness Promise"!

In History, the children have been learning more about schools in the past - looking at classrooms from the 1900s and comparing them to classrooms now.

It's been a busy week! Well done Year 2 - you should be proud of your hard work! Keep it up 😌



## Sandpipers and Moorhens

Year 3 have had a fabulous week this week. All members of staff are super impressed with their recent threat narratives. They have then started fabulously in preparing to write instructions to trap their Iron Man. The children have been learning all about addition and subtraction in Maths, exchanging across tens and ones. The children have now finished their learning on the Bronze Age and have now got the Iron Age to learn about to finish the term. Thank you to all parents that attended the year 3 parent information evening. For those that couldn't attend, please take some time to read through the information that has been sent out.

## Kingfishers and Lapwings

A fantastic week in Year 4! We have moved on to our second writing focus based on Leon and the Place Between and are building up to writing a persuasive text. In maths, we are now looking at addition and subtraction with 4-digit numbers and focusing on our two times tables. We took on the tole of Stone Age people as we traded different items in our history lesson and in Science we have explored food chains. We now have a good understanding of producers, prey and predators. The children are all working very hard! Have a great weekend.

# Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in maths, year 6 have moved on to using a written method for multiplication. Year 5 have been looking at addition and subtraction. In literacy, we have learnt about Anne Frank and what made her brave.

In RE, we learnt about how the River Ganges is important to Hindus. History saw the children come the 1921 and 1911 census. We identified secondary and primary sources. During PSHE, the children learn about rewards and responsibilities. The children have enjoyed learning about sustainability in D&T.

We were so grateful for the sun to appear at the end of the week. At one point we considered building an ark! Have a wonderful weekend!
