Safeguarding News

We are excited to welcome Rock Kidz to Wheelock on Monday! They will be encouraging the children in their workshops to grow in confidence and self-esteem through teaching important life messages through music.

With the ever-increasing number of social media apps available and trending, it is important to remember that they do have age restrictions! As a parent/carer, it is your responsibility to be aware of the current age restrictions in place on the apps that your children are using. In school we are finding an increasing amount of time is spent dealing with social media issues that are happening out of school hours. A reminder that the age restriction for apps such as Snapchat, WhatsApp and TikTok is age 13+, yet we are aware of children from reception upwards using social media apps. We ask that you are vigilant and continuously monitor your child's social media use and also the amount of screen time. Remember, there is an age restriction for a reason!

Enterprise 2024 - KS1 and EYFS

On Thursday, the year 6 children held the first part of their enterprise project. They ran stalls after being given a £10 start-up fund. The children have been purchasing prizes and sweets for their stalls. They have been negotiating with shop keepers to bring down their costs! The KS1 and Reception


