We have been working hard in our new Phonics groups. Please remember you can access the virtual classroom videos through the Tapestry links and regular practise will help us retain our sounds. A huge well done to those who have read and signed the diary every night- amazing work! In Maths,

we have been subitising within 5 and have started to explore circles and triangles. Next week we will be spotting lots of circles and triangles in our provision.

Our week has been based all around Autumn and what changes we see in Autumn. We have had lots of fun exploring the autumnal items in our outdoor area and have shared out Autumn photos. The children were amazing at talking about their photographs! Next week we will be visiting our local church to learn how Christians welcome babies into their faith.

## Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had a great week in Goldfinches and Woodpeckers. The children are getting used to their new classes and routines, making new friendships and showing much more independence - well done everyone.

In Literacy we have been exploring new words from our text - mischievous was a very long word to write but the children loved acting it out!! We have also been spotting question marks in sentences and then writing our own questions too.

Our maths focus has been comparing and ordering numbers. We have used the signs greater than and less than and also ordered 4 numbers from smallest to largest.

In science we have revisited sorting objects into their different materials. We played an 'odd one out' game which was fun. In History we were able to use our knowledge of materials to describe old and new toys.

## Owls and Robins

We have had a really productive week in Year 2 this week. In literacy, we have written our circular narrative based on our book 'The River'. We have worked really hard on applying all of our new skills to make a detailed and interesting story about a journey through different settings. Towards the end of the week we have also started to look at the features of our next writing opportunity, which will be a letter.

In maths, we have been comparing numbers. We have been working with the greater than and less than numbers. We have also been ordering numbers to 100.

Also this week, we have been comparing classrooms from 100 years ago to present. We identified similarities and differences that can be found in these.

In music, we have been creating a score of music. We composed a short tune using low, middle and high notes, which we will be playing to each other next week.

# Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week we have been working hard learning about the inner workings of the hand in science by making our own scientific hand models; furthering our knowledge of online dangers

through emails in Computing and sketching the natural forms of flowers in Art. As well as this, we have enjoyed National Poetry Day in Literacy where we studied some fantastic similes in 'Some Other Names for Rain' by Kate Wakeling.

We have been practising songs for Harvest Festival such as 'Harvest Samba' (cabbages and greens) and sitting 'mostly' beautifully in assembly.

We are still working on addition and subtraction in Maths and enthusiastically using table-top equipment to help with our learning. On top of all of this, we have been concentrating on spellings and presentation as we begin to learn how to write newspaper reports.

Overall, we have had an enlightening, creative and productive week. Well done, Waterbirds!

# Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in literacy, the children have finished their hot write exploration narratives. They have edited and evaluated their work. We have then started to look at a formal report and using language which is not informal in tone.

During maths, year 6 have completed their unit on prime numbers, square and cube numbers, and factors/multiples. Year 5 have looked at addition and subtraction methods this week. It has been good to consolidate methods from Year 4.

During science, we learnt about the impact of exercise, diet and sleep on our bodies. In history, the children discovered the impact of Viking raiders on different settlements by writing letters. In music, we continued to create codes using tuned instruments.

The year 5 children had a great afternoon on Wednesday completing different PE activities. They enjoyed the fresh air and team spirit. Whilst the year 5s completed PE, the Year 6 children visited Crewe Alex to participate in Crucial Crew. The children visited the police, ambulance service and other emergency or support groups to learn how to keep ourselves safe. They behaved superbly and listened excellently. They particularly enjoyed the CPR session and trying on beer goggles!

On Thursday, the children enjoying celebrating National Poetry Day. They have been learning a poem called A Special Kind of Badger. Hawks and Kestrels performed it to each other. Ask the children if they can remember if, they were great! They'll be able to tell you about the badger's problem.

Creativity did not stop indoors, we enjoyed watching the children play on their see-saw made from the logs we have outdoors.


Thank you, Anna, for making some delicious cakes again, the children are always excited to hear what the dessert of the day is!

What a week! Thanks so much to those who supported our MacMillan coffee morning. We raised over £200 for the fantastic charity.


