Sandbach Inter-School Football Tournament





Wheelock's Year 5 and 6 football team were back in action this week, in the second round of the Inter-School Football Tournament at Sandbach United.

Our opening fixture was against Offley in the driving rain. Connor and Wren in defence were sensational, stopping countless attacks. James, who returned to goal after illness ruled him out of the first round, pulled off a string of saves, but Offley took the lead with a brilliant strike that he could do nothing about.

Despite constant Wheelock pressure, with Lowen controlling midfield and Archie using his pace down the right, the boys just couldn't find the back of the net, and the game finished 1-0 to Offley.

Elworth A were up next, a side we lost 5-0 to last time, but with Sam coming off the bench to strengthen midfield, the team started on the front foot and were unlucky not to score after good work from Francesco.

Another well-taken strike from Elworth opened the scoring, before a bizarre ricochet off a player's back doubled their lead. The game finished 2-0 to Elworth, but this was a huge improvement on the last fixture between the sides in November.

Our final match was against the toughest team in the competition, Dingle A. With no substitutes, and the rain now reaching biblical proportions (just ask Miss Millward!), the team could easily have given up, but they started with confidence and were again unlucky to concede an early goal.

The Dingle then doubled their lead, before a charging run from Sam would surely have ended in a goal had he not been brought down just outside the area. Sadly, the resulting free kick went wide of the upright.

Lowen and Cameron were both tremendous in midfield, while Francesco and Wren, who had returned to the pitch following his earlier injury, continued to give 100%. Although the game finished 4-0 to The Dingle, that was another massive improvement on the 7-0 scoreline a month ago.

Wheelock now go into the final tournament next week, where they will be pitted against different teams, and they should be extremely confident of causing a few upsets.

Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

A fabulous week of learning in Reception this week. We had a fabulous start with our amazing Nursery Rhyme Nativity. Thank you to all of our wonderful parents for attending this. We used our super singing voices to retell the nativity story. In Maths, we have been composing and decomposing numbers to understand that different parts can make a whole. We used our Numberblock friends to create stampolines and represented the numbers to five in different ways. In our topic, we have been learning about a significant figure, Tim Peake. We found super facts and learned that he was the first British astronaut to go into Space for over 20 years. We have been using our joining skills to make 3D models and have made careful choices about how to decorate them. Keep up the great work everybody!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We would like to say thank you to all our families for your support with the Carol Nativity at the Church this week. The children thoroughly enjoyed sharing their songs, they looked amazing and it was a joy to hear everyone singing Carols together. Thank you for sharing your photographs and videos on Tapestry too - the children have loved watching themselves.

In Literacy this week we have been exploring the different text and language structures of 'Instructions'. Next week we will begin to write our own instructions. Can your child describe their journey to the church to you at home?

In maths we have been making the numbers 8 and 9 - looking for patterns and working out the different ways that these numbers can be made. We are very impressed with the participation on Numbots - well done everyone!

Our RE this week has linked closely with our Nativity and we have been thinking about 'meaningful gifts'. We had to draw a gift that we would give to someone and explain why they thought it was a meaningful gift.

Owls and Robins

Another super week for Year 2!

In Literacy, the children have been busy completing their 'hot write' - a setting narrative about a garden in winter. The children have produced some beautiful writing using similes and imaginative ideas. Well done!

In Whole Class Reading, the children started to explore their new text - a non-fiction book about Queen Victoria. The children have considered new vocabulary like 'monarch' and 'veil' and used their inference skills to think about how Victoria would have felt when she took the throne aged 18!

In Maths, the children have worked hard to solve addition and subtraction problems. It's been fantastic to see the children become more confident using specific methods to work out the answers! The children have now successfully completed another Maths Unit!

Science this week looked at the importance of a balanced diet! The children were very excited to design their own meals - making sure to include items from each food group after learning what each food group does for their bodies!

In PSHE, the children continued their "myHappyMind" journey. The children have been thinking carefully about what character strengths they show often. The children thought particularly about 'love and kindness' and made a 'love and kindness' heart for someone who had shown this strength towards them!

In RE, the children thoroughly enjoyed thinking about advent. We had lots of fun sharing about advent calendars. The children looked at Christian advent calendars and how they are often decorated with pictures from the Christmas Story.

We were very proud of the children this week, when they demonstrated lots of team-work, resilience and communication skills in DT. The. Holden worked in small groups to make a chair for Baby-Bear but only using paper and tape! The children faced many challenges with this task but overcame them well!

We can't wait to see more amazing learning (and festive fun!) from Year 2 over the next two weeks!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

Year 3 have been combining their geography learning with their literacy learning this week. We have been rehearsing how to write informed sentences with technical vocabulary on volcanoes. Today, we practised this through role play by being narrators to volcano-based videos. In maths, the children have been showing great improvement in their 3,4 and 8 times table. In science, we have searched for magnetic items and have discovered that not all metals are magnetic. We have ordered the nativity story and discussed how Christians show kindness at Christmas. In geography, we designed earthquake-proof buildings and in DT selected our final design for our information electrical poster.

Kingfishers and Lapwings

This week in year 4 we have started to look at our times tables in our maths lessons, we have looked at the 3, 6 & 9's and solved problems using the facts. In Literacy we have introduced our new text, The Great Kapok Tree. The children have described the rainforest and thought about the impact of deforestation on the wildlife that lives there. In computing we have looked at plagiarism and how we can avoid this. In geography we have explored different rocks and where they come from as well as exploring rocks within our school environment. The children have enjoyed being able to use the hall for lunch and going to assembly again. Another busy week so we hope you all have a restful weekend.

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in maths, year 6 have been dividing fractions whilst year 5 have been adding and subtracting fractions. In literacy, we have looked at new vocabulary linked to newspaper reports. In science, the children have explored how long it takes planets to orbit the sun. During RE, we discussed the Christmas story and its validity. In geography, the children continued their work on climate change. We have started to rehearse for our carol concert

on Monday 16th December. The children enjoyed concluding their art unit by creating a piece of graffiti with a powerful message.

There has been great excitement this week as Eagles moved into the new building. Hopefully, Hawks and Kestrels with move in during the next week. The children are currently voting on a name for the new building. We will keep you updated!


