Cygnets and Pufflings


A super week in Reception. We have been retelling the story of Little Red using the story friends. We used our Phonics to write some super sentences and have worked hard to remember finger spaces. In Maths, we have been representing 10 and have been making numbers using two parts e.g 5 and 2 are the part, 7 is my whole. In our topic, we have continued to look at how our bodies have changed from a baby to now and have explored the human life cycle. We had a special celebration for World Book Day and shared lots of amazing stories. Our teachers were super impressed by our outfits! Well done everybody!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

A Super busy week in Woodpeckers and Goldfinches. We have been doing lots of assessments this week in reading and Maths. The children have shown a very mature attitude and have completed the tasks with smiles. We are very proud of them all.

In PSHE we have continued to talk about ways that we keep our body and mind healthy. We have been making choices regarding food, exercise and bedtimes which has made for some interesting conversations!

In Whole Class Reading we have are enjoying the book:



Because it is a non-fiction text, the children have loved choosing the pages they want to explore themselves. This week we have focused on finding new vocabulary in the text.

World book day was a lovely way to celebrate or love of reading. We completed lots of fun activities including, hunt the book characters, making a hat and sharing stories with our Y5 buddies. The children were so excited to swap a book too.



Owls and Robins

This week in Literacy the children continued to delve into their new book 'Grandad's Island'. The children have been busy describing a setting using adverbs, expanded noun phrases, alliteration and exclamation marks!

The week was of course, especially exciting with World Book Day. We absolutely loved the children's enthusiasm and enjoyment throughout the day! There were some fabulously, creative costumes and it was so lovely to hear the children talking passionately about reading! Our activities during the day were based around the story 'The Day the Crayons Quit' - which the children thoroughly enjoyed. The children loved working together to craft signs that other classroom items might use to similarly protest their wrongdoings - glue sticks being left with no lids, chairs not being tucked in, iPads being overused! The children also had lots of fun: reading with a Year 4 buddy, creating a new front-cover of our story, drawing themselves in their World Book Day outfit & book swapping! Thank you for all your support during this day!

In Maths, the children continued to explore multiplication, looking closer at the 5 x table. The children have also been practising their adding skills in arithmetic!

During History, the children learned all about Amelia Earhart. The children read an 'eyewitness account' from a lady who saw Amelia land In Ireland after completing the flight from Canada. The children showed lots of curiosity and then creativity as they used role-play to explore the experience of the eyewitness! Can your child remember the only thing Amelia Earhart had consumed on her joined? Can your child recall the first thing Amelia asked for when she landed?

Things got very messy this week in Art as the children started their new topic. On Monday, the children demonstrated their knowledge and understanding of colour-mixing and completed some Art maths with the paint - first mixing secondary colours before experimenting to make different shades!

In RE, the children thought about 'admiration'. The children considered how Christians might feel if Jesus came to visit them and what they would do to make this a special occasion.

Finally, just a quick thank you to those who were able to attended the Year 2 Residential Meeting on Wednesday. For anyone who wasn't able - please check the Year 2 section of the school website for the PowerPoint. If you have any questions, please do let us know! We think the residential will be such a fantastic opportunity for the children & we are already looking forward to it!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

This week year 3 have been continuing their learning on fractions in maths. In literacy, we have been analysing mischief narratives and immersing ourselves in language for our own writing. In science, we had important conversations about how light and reflections play an important role in keeping us safe. Children created safety advice posters on what to wear to keep yourself safe in the dark. In DT, we looked at seasonality of fruit and vegetables in the UK and the positives and negatives of importing and trading. In geography, we have been describing the location and physical features of Antarctica. In music, we continued to learn our 'step back baby step back' rap and attempted to make our own version. Year 3 have finished all their spring term assessments, and we are very proud of all the progress they are making. Well done Year 3!

Kingfishers and Lapwings

This week in year 4 we have celebrated World Book Day with lots of fun activities across the school and dressing up. The children focused on the book, 'When the crayon quit' which is a great read with your child if you have not already. In English, the children are reading the story Jemmy Button which is the most beautifully illustrated book. Ask your child to tell you the story as they will be writing their own version where a character goes on a journey. In

order to do this successfully the children have been looking at the language and structure that will help them read this. We have been working on fractions for the last two weeks in maths and the children have been comparing mixed numbers and learning about improper fractions. We have also set up a new competition between the two classes on Time Tables Rockstars ahead so please encourage your child to play as much as possible! We have ben continuing to learn about rocks and this week have been investigating the properties of different rocks. If your children tell you they have been eating biscuits in school then you are hearing correctly. We are designing and baking biscuits this half term but before we can do that, we have to do the fun part which is evaluating. We have been continuing with our topics of animation in computing which the children are experts in!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

During maths, year 6 have been focussing on algebra whilst year 5 have started to understand percentages. In literacy, we have looked at diary entries to help us immerse in Shackleton's feelings. In science, we have looked at the life cycle of a human. In computing, the children thoroughly engaged in basic game design on purple mash. In PSHE, we looked at the impact of smoking on our bodies. The children enjoyed using colours to describe clothes.

On Thursday, we had a fantastic World Book Day. The children's outfits were excellent and they thoroughly enjoyed the different activities. Reading with reception and year 1 was a highlight as was making our school equipment quit.

A great week. Enjoy the sunshine- hopefully it'll make a reappearance this weekend.


