Class News

Penguins and Puffins

Wow- what a fabulous week we have had! Thank you for coming to our Nativity. We loved putting on a show for you all! In Maths we have been looking at composition of 4 and 5 and learning about day and night. We have worked hard in Phonics and are continuing with our new sounds. Remember to practise reading or flash cards every night and sign the diary so that you get your gold star.

We have been learning all about Space travel and learned about Tim Peake. We then made flying rockets. We created a pocket on the back of the rocket that had to be air tight so the pressure would build and eventually the rocket would blast off.

The children investigated different pressures of breath and lengths of straw to see if it changed how far the rocket would fly. Next week we will be learning all about Christmas and we can't wait!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

It's been a very busy week this week. Woodpeckers and Goldfinches have reached the end of our Literacy unit and the story 'Rapunzel'. After our brief visit from the witch, we have all written instructions to catch her if she dare return!! We have explored the structure of our instructions - Title, list, order of instructions and using bossy verbs. We also finished with a word of WARNING! Well done everyone.

Our maths has been all about subtraction this week. We have used lots of mathematical language related to this - Can your child remember? Our work has been very practical but we have moved onto using number lines to jump back too.

Art this week was all about the artist Clarice Cliff. We used her 'Circle Tree' design to inspire our own paper plates this week. We were very impressed with the attention to detail this week and how the children applied their knowledge of colour mixing to create their designs.

We are so excited to perform our Nativity next week - don't forget to book a seat on Arbor. Our rehearsals are going very well and we are so impressed with how quickly the children have learnt their lines. Well done! Owls and Robins

Year 2 have had a very busy week this week.

In literacy, we have started to explore our new text of a diary this week. We have also looked at the new vocabulary and used it in our own sentences.

In maths, we have been problem solving with addition and subtraction missing number problems.

In Geography, we have continued to compare the UK and Kenya. We have really enjoyed looking at the similarities and differences between us.

We had an RE day on Wednesday, where we learnt about the Christmas story and how Christians celebrate Christmas. We also had a fantastic visit to the church where we met the characters from the story, listen to their version of events as well as ask them questions.

Today in D&T we have planned our ginger bread baking. We have looked at the preparation, ingredients and method for this, ready for next week when we are baking.

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have tested the strength of magnets by seeing how many paperclips different types can suspend in a chain. Across Waterbirds, the teachers have enjoyed watching all of the huge effort the children have put into their second week of assessments and have been wowed with the progress many have made.

We have begun to get a little festive in classrooms; are looking forward to the results of the Elf Run and have been practising singing carols in readiness for our carol concert.

We are continuing to work on multiplication and division in Maths and enthusiastically using counters, number lines and 100 squares to help understand groups, arrays and related facts. On top of all of this, we have been continuing to learn the skills of a scientific report writer for an information text, building up to our hot task.

Overall, we have had a fantastic week - great stuff Waterbirds!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

Another great week for our oldest children.

We have continued to work through our SATS and NFER assessments. The children have worked hard to answer in detail and accurately. They are all finished now - well done!

In maths, year 5 have had a look at equivalent fractions and being able to convert fractions. Year 6 have completed a unit on measures. They looked at imperial and metric.

In literacy, we have started to write our letter based on the book FArTHER. The children have been trying to write in the first person with a formal tone. They have really developed their language recently.

In science, we focussed on shadows and how they are formed. We looked at how they change during the day. In the woodland we enjoyed being creative by making bug hotels, climbing trees and playing hide and seek - sorry about the muddy clothes! During computing, the children used Scratch to create scoring games. In RE, we explored what parables are and what the morals behind them mean. During geography, we explored our local area by using OS maps. We learnt what the different symbols mean and how to create our own maps.
