Class News

Penguins and Puffins

A fun filled week this week! We have really enjoyed retelling the Little Red story in Literacy and using describing words such as 'fearsome' and 'brave'.

In Maths, we have been subitising, representing 8 using the 5 and a 'little bit more' structure and have revisited ordering numbers to 8. We have also practised speedy recall of one more and less than numbers to 10.

In our topic 'Once upon a time', we have been learning all about homes and family life in the past. We enjoyed sharing photos of our home learning and discussing how things have changed from 'a long time ago'. We had an amazing World Book Day. We shared special story time with our buddies, had an author visit and loved story time with our family! A huge thank you to everybody for making such an effort to dress up and share their favourite stories and also a special thank you to FOWs for giving away some amazing books! Well done for a great week Reception!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

We have had another great week in Woodpeckers and Goldfinches. The children continue to impress us with their eagerness to learn and their increasing independence.

The children are working so hard in their phonics and we have seen some amazing progress. In Literacy this week we have been adding the suffixes 'ed', 'ing', and 'er' to verbs and listening to how this changes the sentence. We will be having a go at using these in our writing next week.

In Maths we have been subtracting within 20. This has involved crossing the 10, for example 12-5. We have been using number lines to countback and ten frames and counters to visualise the calculation. It has been great to see hear the children work though the problems using their knowledge of numbers to 10 to help them.

We had fun on Monday tasting fruit in DT as we began to think about what fruits we would like to put in a smoothie. We will continue next week by designing their own smoothie and the designing the label for the packaging.

World Book Day was a fun filled day. We listened to lots of stories throughout the day, as well as taking part in quizzes about book characters and book titles. We even did a book treasure hunt around school; finding 30 different book titles. Thank you so much to our parents for the amazing outfits the children wore and to those of you who were able to join us at the end of the day to share a story - it really made our day feel special.



Owls and Robins

What a busy week we have had in Year 2!

In Literacy, we have continued to explore our book for this half term - 'Grandad's Island'. We have looked at the vocabulary used within the text, used role-play to develop our language and understanding of being within the pictures and applied this to some fantastic setting descriptions.

In Maths, we have finished our unit on multiplication and division. We worked really hard on this and understanding the links between them.

In Geography, we looked at human and physical features over the world. We located these on a world map and discussed these features.

We have also created different textures in art using a variety of materials - we really enjoyed exploring these and experimenting with colours and materials.

Also, this week we have had World Book Day. We all looked fantastic in our costumes and had lots of fun decorating our classroom door, book day activities and reading with buddies and family.

Well done Year 2 for a hard-working week!

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have begun our science topic of plants, children have successfully identified the features and functions of parts of a flowering plant. Across Waterbirds, we have continued our learning of fractions in maths, understanding the fundamentals of the denominator and the numerator and realising that a fraction involves equal parts of a whole. As well as this, we have enjoyed beginning our new Geography topic about settlements.

In Literacy, all have successfully begun to understand the features of a twisted tale, we have been reading the vehicle text - The Lost Happy Endings by Carol Ann Duffy and Jane Ray understanding how writers produce effective narratives through language choices. The children particularly enjoyed coming up with ghoulish descriptions of evil characters!

Waterbirds have thoroughly enjoyed participating in World Book Day. The children enjoyed dressing up and the opportunity to read with adults at the end of the day. Waterbirds are now ready to focus on learning going forward for the rest of the term. Well done for all your effort this week Waterbirds!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

What a busy and unusual week.

This week in maths, year 6 have looked at percentages whilst year 5 continued to work on decimals. In literacy, we have started to explore new vocabulary linked to The Hound of the Baskervilles. During geography, the children looked at graphs showing temperature data from two deserts.

This week has had three main focuses: D&T, world book day and French day.

In D&T, the children have been sewing and have made stuffed toys. Their stitching and resilience was excellent. Sewing can be super tough but they did an awesome job. On Thursday we celebrated world book day. There were some fantastic costumes and pyjamas. We looked doing book quizzes, book hunts and reading with parents at the end of the day. Finally, on Friday, the children enjoyed French day. We had a workshop where we discussed how French can help us in the future.


