

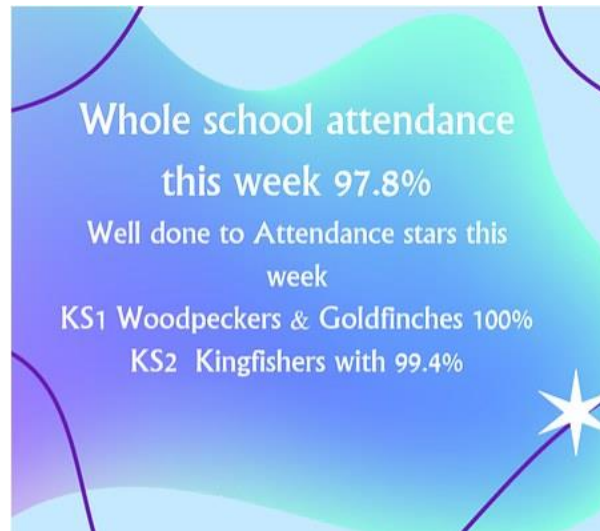

Regular attendance at free eye tests is essential for supporting the health, learning, and overall development of children across Cheshire East. Many vision difficulties in children are not immediately obvious but can significantly affect reading ability, concentration, behaviour, and participation in the classroom. Routine eye examinations enable early identification and treatment of potential issues, helping to prevent long-term impacts on educational attainment and wellbeing. As NHS-funded eye tests are free for children, schools are encouraged to support and promote regular check-ups as a simple and effective way to help pupils achieve their full potential.

Class News

Cygnets and Pufflings

We have had another busy and exciting week in Reception! In Drawing Club, the children have been exploring the story Jack and the Beanstalk. They have loved using their imaginations to draw and talk about the Giant and in readiness for Year 1, we all sat down to do our writing together this week, encouraging the children to show more independence with generating and recording their words and sentences.

In Maths, we have introduced using rekenreks (counting frames with beads) to support our understanding of number. The children have been practising counting and subitising - using

"one finger, one push" - to move the correct number of beads. We used our number bonds to 10 knowledge to help us with this.

Our topic work has focused on farm animals. The children have enjoyed matching animals to their babies and learning new vocabulary such as calf, foal and kid. We have also been busy creating our own farm maps, thinking carefully about where different animals live and what features a farm might have. The children showed great creativity and enthusiasm in their drawings and practised their cutting skills to add parts to their maps too.

In PSHCE, we have been thinking about using kind words and how our words can make others feel. The children have been practising speaking kindly to one another and recognising positive behaviours in the classroom. We have also continued to use our happy breathing techniques to help us stay calm and ready to learn, and the children are becoming increasingly confident in using these independently when needed.

It is lovely to see the children continuing to grow in confidence, kindness and independence each week – well done Pufflings and Cygnets!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Year 1 have had a busy and exciting week full of learning and fun!

In **Literacy**, we have started our new book *Whirly Twirly Me*. The story explores emotions and feelings such as anger and upset, and how we can make things better by talking to trusted people. The children have been using some fantastic emotive language to describe how the characters are feeling.

In **Maths**, we have been learning all about fractions. The children have been working hard on recognising halves and quarters and have shown great enthusiasm when exploring these new concepts.

During **Whole Class Reading**, the children have loved learning more about bees. They particularly enjoyed discussing whether they would rather be a queen bee or a worker bee and explaining their reasons.

In **Music**, we explored pitch. The children imagined they were superheroes and used their bodies to experiment with high and low pitch sounds — it was lots of fun!

On **Friday**, we had an exciting visit to **Park Farm**. The children loved seeing a range of animals and learning all about what farmers do. We also learned more about bees, including pollination and beekeeping, and even had the chance to taste some delicious honey.

Well done Year 1 for a fantastic week of learning!

Owls and Robins

A super week for Year 2!

In Literacy this week the children looked at their new text - The King Who Banned the Dark! The children first made predictions about the story, they then explored new vocabulary before looking at the suffixes -er and -ness!

In Maths, the children have continued to impress us with their understanding of fractions! The children have found quarters and thirds of both shapes and numbers!

In Science, the children looked at what a plant needs to survive! They were confident explaining what could happen to plants if they were not grown in the correct environment!

There was lots of enthusiasm again in History where the children looked at Motte and Bailey castles!

In Music, the children worked in groups to compose a piece of music. The children thought about the beat and structure.

Finally, in Art we looked at printing!

Keep up the great work, Year 2!

Sandpipers and Moorhens

This week in Year 3 we have had a fantastic time learning across the curriculum. In maths, we have been calculating the quantity of change by converting amounts and using written methods of subtraction.

In literacy, we explored character and humour by discussing how to be mischievous and cause harmless havoc for a pesky teacher, which led to lots of imaginative ideas and laughter. In science, we investigated reflections using mirrors and identified symmetry in shapes, letters and numbers.

Our history learning focused on Ancient Egypt, where we learned about the gods and goddesses and discussed the symbolism shown in their images. During art, we began designing our own scrolls, again using Ancient Egyptian imagery, and really enjoyed exploring hieroglyphics. What a fantastic week of learning!

Kingfishers and Lapwings

In Literacy, we planned and wrote our own imaginative portal narratives set at a magic show. We worked hard to include speech, fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases, effective verbs and alternative nouns to make our writing engaging and exciting for the reader.

In Maths, we completed our first unit on decimals, focusing on hundredths and place value. We even challenged ourselves by dividing numbers by 10 and 100 and making important links between decimals and place value.

Our Science lessons were full of investigation as we tested different materials in electrical circuits to discover whether they were conductors or insulators. We found that metal objects, such as paper clips and sharpeners, allowed the electrical current to pass through, meaning they were conductors. In French, we listened carefully to a story and practised recognising different jungle animals.

In PSHE, we explored friendships and conflict resolution by discussing different scenarios and working together to solve problems and repair situations thoughtfully. In RE, we learned about the Shema prayer and explored why the mezuzah and tallit are so important within the Jewish community.

In History, we discovered how Christianity spread throughout Britain through the work of St Aidan, St Augustine and St Columba, before creating paper dolls to represent their significance.

Finally, in Art, we had great fun creating soap sculptures inspired by the work of Barbara Hepworth. Have a great weekend!

Kestrels and Red Kites

This week in maths, we have been looking at coordinates and translations (where we pick up a shape and take it for a walk). The children have been able to move shapes by counting spaces but also by using the coordinates to help move a spot on a grid.

In literacy, we have thoroughly enjoyed reading our new text, 'A shelter for sadness.' The children have created shelters and been able to think about their chosen emotion (fear, jealousy and anger) and how this might look.

During PSHE, we have been looking on online communities and how we stay safe in them by following age restrictions. In history, we had a debate for which city state was the most powerful - Athens or Sparta. We decided that both have the positives and negatives, so neither could be better. We also explored democracy in Ancient Greece and in Britain. In French, the children used adjectives to describe planets, such as the Earth is blue and green. In music, we have enjoyed using the glockenspiels to play 'Somewhere over the rainbow'. This has been tricky but the children showed great perseverance to learn the tune. During computing, we learnt how to edit images in Word making them different colours.

We enjoyed break the rules day on Wednesday. Thank you for your donations which will contribute to improving our school grounds.

Eagles and Hawks

Year 6 have had an energetic and enriching week of learning, diving deep into several exciting areas of the curriculum. In **Maths**, they revisited key arithmetic skills, sharpening their confidence with multiplication, division and methods for finding percentages of amounts.

In **Literacy**, pupils crafted firstperson narratives inspired by *Paradise Sands*, experimenting with techniques to build tension and atmosphere in their writing.

Our **History** lessons took us back to the Blitz, where children explored primary sources such as photographs to understand what life was like in UK cities during World War II.

To round off the week, Year 6 learned about **Sir David Attenborough**, celebrating his remarkable life and achievements as he marks his 100th birthday today — a true inspiration to us all. We also want to wish Year 6 the very best of luck for their SATs tests next week and thank all parents for the help and support given with homework throughout the year; we are incredibly proud of everything Year 6 have achieved so far this year and the effort and application they show on a daily basis.

Be Your Best

Be Your Best is a positive, empowering programme that helps children feel calm and confident as they prepare for SATs, the Multiplication Check and other end-of-year assessments. It offers simple strategies to build a positive mindset; ease worries and approach each assessment with self-belief.

The programme includes short videos, also available as podcasts, for use in the lead-up to assessments, the day before and afterwards. Each one focuses on mindset and wellbeing, helping children feel prepared to give their best. A workbook accompanies each video, allowing children to reflect and practise the strategies they have learned. These resources are **also available on the Parent App**.

Dear parents,
Places are now available to join a new 12-week football course every Monday at The Oaks Academy, which is open to both boys and girls.

Our courses teach children correct football techniques by FA qualified coaches who have full DBS (CRB) clearance to work with children. The structure for the course is 'FUN through Football,' building confidence for total beginners and moving onto more complex sessions for experienced players.

We provide a ball per player for the majority of our drills ensuring children get more touches of the ball and improve quicker than conventional coaching where children are waiting around to have a turn. The sessions are held on the fantastic astroturf pitch so trainers should be worn. Players are also advised to bring a still drink for the session.

The club has links to local junior teams of which players will be able to play for at the weekend. Players who show advanced ability on the course will be recommended for trials at professional academies. Players who have previously attended courses are currently playing for Preston North End, Blackburn Rovers, Manchester United, Liverpool, Blackpool, Everton, Barroley, Bolton, Oldham, Rochdale and Wigan.

The cost of the course is just £6.67 per week, which is payable in two instalments. The first payment of £30 is due when booking your child on and the second payment of £50 due at the first session. Parents are encouraged to watch the sessions but are welcome to leave children, as every session is fully supervised.

NEW TOURNAMENT FORMAT

Every four weeks we have a tournament in order for the children to put their new-found skills into practice with medals awarded at the end of the course for various categories.

ALL PLAYERS WILL RECEIVE A TROPHY AND MEDAL at the presentation, which is held on the final week of the course. Additional trophies will also be awarded in each group from categories including: Best Attitude, Star Player, Most Improved Player, Most Promising Player and Hardest Working Player.
