

Class News

Penguins and Puffins

Another great week in Reception - well done Puffins and Penguins (a)! In Literacy we received a letter from Joop (the main character in our story), asking us to write her a letter telling her why we would like to be her side-kick and what our superhero powers are. The children have planned their letters this week and will be writing them next week.

In Maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of 'more than' and 'fewer than' when comparing two quantities and also talked about what it means when the groups are 'equal'. In our topic session we have enjoyed learning about British birds as part of British Bird Watching Week. Puffins enjoyed a music session all about 'The Flight of the Bumblebee, while Penguins had fun in a very wet and muddy Forest School session!

Goldfinches and Woodpeckers

Woodpeckers and Goldfinches have been working so hard this week. In Literacy we have begun to look at how Hermelin wrote letters to the different characters in the story to explain to them where their missing items were. We have focused on writing clear instructions and also looked at using the suffixes - er and est. We have explored how words change. for example. high, higher, highest and short, shorter, shortest. We have also started to plan our own letters and are looking forward to completing them next week.

Woodpeckers and Goldfinches have really enjoyed watching Michael Rosen perform 'Chocolate Cake' so we have used another one of his popular stories this week to think about how we have to overcome obstacles in our lives. 'We're going on a Bear Hunt' worked really well and the children have thoroughly enjoyed acting out the different parts of the story too.

In Maths this week we have completed our first unit all about numbers to 20. Great work on Freckle at home has really supported the learning in the classroom as we are now moving on to 'Number Bonds within 20'. Well done everyone.

In Science this week we have been grouping animals according to their diet. We have learnt the new vocabulary, Carnivore, Herbivore and Omnivore. Don't forget to complete the challenge on Purple Mash related to this.

Owls and Robins

In year 2 this week, we have been really enjoying developing our ideas for our set of instructions on how to make a habitat for our own Bog Baby. We have been looking at the features and language used within this piece of writing.

In maths, we have started our new unit on multiplication and division. We have explored grouping and arrays, ready to progress this further.

In history, we have continued our topic on flight and did hot seating with Neil Armstrong about the first flight to the moon - we found this really interesting. In science, we have looked at world habitats and matched animals to their habitats.

Also this week, we have completed work on internet safety day and mental health wellbeing week. We have really enjoyed these tasks.

Well done for a hard-working week Year 2!

Sandpipers, Swans and Kingfishers

In Waterbirds this week, we have been uncovering how harmful ultraviolet light from the Sun can be damaging in science. Across Waterbirds, teachers have been enjoying tutoring the children about the names of facial body parts in French. As well as this, we have enjoyed making Egyptian artwork on our papyrus paper.

We are changing focus in literacy, now looking to master the techniques of clear instruction texts, using bossy verbs and the precise clear instructive language. We will be writing instructions next week to how to mummify a tomato, which is in conjunction with Egyptian theme. In Maths, year 4's have been introducing themselves to the tricky concepts of perimeter and length, whilst year 3 have been enthusiastically measuring with millimetres, centimetres and metres.

More broadly, Waterbirds have participated well in Safer Internet Day on Tuesday and enjoyed thinking about what makes them happy as a celebration of Mental Health week. Well done for all your effort this week Waterbirds!

Eagles, Hawks and Kestrels

This week in literacy, the children have analysed the bargain letter example text. We have attempted to Use formal and emotional language to write speeches and sentences to persuade. Finally, we have started to plan our own bargain letter.

In maths, year 6 have continued to look at algebra. They have been able to solve equations. They have been writing equations too. In year 5, the children have multiplied fractions. They have looked at fractions and whole numbers.

In science, the children learnt about Darwin. In RE, we learnt about Muslim places of worship. During history, the children identified what it was like to experience a Royal Progress.

Unfortunately, we didn't have our rugby session on Thursday due to the rain. We will do this on Friday 1st March instead.

The children enjoyed sharing what matters for them during PSHE as part of mental health week.


This week the children have enjoyed the craft activities, pom pom making, bookmark making to name just a few.


