### PARTNERS FOR CHANGE ETHIOPIA CLOTHES COLLECTION


It's time for our annual Bags2School collection to help raise funds to support a new school in Ethiopia called Tibase M school in Debre Birhan about 3 hours drive north of Addis Ababa.

The money raised will go towards funding a breakfast club at the school so the poorer children in the community will receive 1 hot meal a day at school before the day starts. This not only gives them enough energy to stay awake for the whole school day but it also encourages them to attend school as this may well be the only food they get that day, so not only is it improving the well being of the child it is also improving the education level of the individual children.

The children at Tibase M school in Ethiopia have heard that William Hogarth school in Chiswick, England are going to help them and they are very excited!
