CLUB INFORMATION

New Club - Mini Engineers club — a fun, hands on club where children will explore building, problem-solving and basic engineering concepts.

Pupil Premium Grant/FSM - We have 2 Pupil Premium Grant/FSM places reserved for each club. If your child is in receipt of Pupil Premium Grant/FSM and they would like to join a club, please send an email to the admin team (admin@hogarth.hounslow.sch.uk) and state which club you would like to book your child on. We will then contact you directly to confirm if the space is available or offer an alternative club.

Tax Free Childcare vouchers - If you would like to pay by your Tax Free Childcare Account, please send an email to the admin team (admin@hogarth.hounslow.sch.uk) and state which club you would like to book. We will then contact you directly to confirm the space and arrange payment.

Uniform – Children must have their P.E. kits for Dance, Gymnastics and Football.

Refunds – Refunds are only provided if a club does not run and is cancelled by school. Fees cannot be refunded if a child changes their mind or if a day is missed due to absences.

If we do not have sufficient numbers to run the club, you will be notified and refunds will be provided for club for any club cancellations.


Class	Star(s) of the week	Description

Lemon crunch cookies makes 8

Ingredients

270g self-raising flour 175g granulated sugar 200g butter or dairy free spread 1 medium egg 1/2 lemon

Method

Preheat oven 170°c / 350°f / gas mark 4

- 1 Zest and juice the lemon
- 2 Mix the butter and sugar together until creamy
- 3 Slowly mix in the egg or equivalent
- 4 Add the remaining ingredients
- 5 Roll the dough into a sausage shape
- 6 Cut into 8 even slices and place onto a greased
- 7 Cook for approximately 20 mins until cooked

Example substitute ingredients: Gluten-free flour Cook in a slightly calder oven and leave in far slightly longer until cooked.

Butter Replace for a dairy free spread.

1 medium egg Replace for 70g mashed npe banana ar 70g smooth apple sauce plus 5g baking pawder.

White chocolate and raspberry cupcake makes 12

Ingredients

150g margarine 150g caster sugar 3 medium eggs 150g self raising flour 5g baking powder 50ml milk 100g white chocolate

Chef TIP raspberries are more affordable and taste just as delicious with no waste!

Method

Preheat oven 180°c

- 1 Line your muffin tins with paper cases
- 2 Sieve the self-raising flour with the baking powder
- 3 Cream the margarine with caster sugar until light
- 4 Add the eggs one by one, beating well between each
- 5 Break the white chocolate into small chunks and fold into the flour mix
- 7 Add the milk until well combined
- 8 Divide equally between the paper cases and bake for approx. 20-25 minutes or until well risen and golden
- 9 Remove from the oven and cool on a wire rack
