This week's spelling is again for words that end in <u>one vowel</u> then <u>one consonant</u>, the final consonant is usually **doubled** before a suffix beginning with a vowel if the last syllable is stressed.

## Some words do not follow the rule:

<u>tra</u>velled <u>can</u>celled labelled

Forwords ending in 't', add a 'k' to keep the 'hard' 'k' sound at the end of the root word.

picnicked trafficking panicked
