The 'shun' sound at the end of a word is can be spelt 'tion', 'sion', 'cian' or 'ssion'. 'cian' is often for occupations (jobs).

'ssion' is often used if the root word ends in 'ss', 'mit' or 'cede' / 'ceed'.
