

# *Year 5 Creative Home Learning project Summer 1*

- **Civil Rights Campaign Poster**

- Create a poster for one of the key movements (e.g., Bristol Bus Boycott or against Section 28), as if you were living in that time.
- Include slogans, imagery, and facts from the movement.

- **Time-Travel Interview**

- Write or record a fictional interview with someone involved in one of the civil rights moments (e.g., Paul Stephenson from the Bristol Bus Boycott, Jayaben Desai from Grunwick).
- Think about the questions you'd ask and how they might respond.

- **Poetry or Spoken Word**

- Write a poem inspired by one of the events or groups (like the Wheelchair Warriors).

- **Mini Documentary**

- Use a phone or tablet to create a 2–5-minute mini-doc about one of the movements.
- Include narration, photos, and even act out scenes if you like!

- **News Report Reenactment**

- Pretend you're a 1970s or 1980s reporter covering the Grunwick strike or a Section 28 protest.
- Write and perform a short "news segment."

- **Speech**

Create a Martin Luther King Jr inspired speech on a topic you feel strongly about.

## **Shadow Box Diorama**

- Build a 3D scene in a shoebox to represent a civil rights moment (e.g., a Grunwick picket line or a Section 28 protest).
- Use paper cutouts, Lego figures, or drawn characters to bring it to life.

## **Rights & Resistance Quilt (Paper Version)**

- Create a "paper quilt" by decorating individual squares with art or writing about different people/events.
- Then stick them together to make a full-sized display piece.
- Great for group or family projects too.
