## **Happy New Year!**



I am so excited that I am able to start 2025 by sharing some fantastic news with you. On Friday, governors completed their due diligence work on the contractor bids for the playground refurbishment. As a result, we have been able to appoint Educational Play Environments to undertake refurbishment of the *Front Playground* and the *Sensory Playground*, as well as installing an outside classroom in the *Back Playground*. I have included an overview of the designs for you to begin exploring what we have planned and we will arrange a display in school so that you can come and look at the large plans and diagrams. I will of course keep you updated in terms of when the work will begin. Our thanks go to the Local Authority for providing the much-needed funding to achieve our vision for the outside space.

We continue to work with children, staff and contractors on developing a detailed plan for the back playground which meets our needs. I look forward to sharing the detail of this with you once we have a finalised design that we are happy with.

This year, we are also implementing a new communication tool – Reach More Parents, as part of the school's strategic communication plan. This will help to ensure that communication becomes even more targeted, so that parents receive the communication that is pertinent to them: class specific newsfeeds, letters and calendars. When we reach the roll-out phase of implementation, I will provide further details so that you can maximise the benefits of this improvement in our communication strategy.

Finally, if you haven't yet had a chance to look at the new school prospectus, please do – there are copies in the school office and a lovely flipbook on the school website. It captures the spirit of the school so beautifully and our thanks go out to Ferry, Katie, Bronwen and Kelly for all their hard work in pulling this together on our behalf, and to Alice, Eleanor and the FOWHS team for organising printing and distribution in the local community.
