Message from the Headteacher

Today feels like a wonderful Spring day – bright, fresh and full of promise. The bulbs are beginning to come out and birds are visiting the bird feeders that Key Stage 1 have made as part of their Science learning.

You will have noted that final SATs results have been published relating to academic year 2018/19. There is further information about the results on the school website, which you can find by following the link:

Some of the highlights for you to take away from the data include our school's success in Early Years, Phonics and Key Stage 1 where we outperformed both National and Local Authority. If looked at in isolation, our Key Stage 2 results are disappointing across the board. However, it is important to recognise that the SATs results themselves provide only some of the information about both the children and the school. Cohorts of children vary immensely in so many ways, including starting points, needs, and a range of social and emotional factors – I could go on. What these results do not show is how the children were supported through outstanding teaching to develop effective learning behaviours that will serve them well into the future, or how much in-year progress they made. Key Stage 2 SATs assess how much the children have learned in Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 – in fact only about 10% of the papers covers Year 6 learning and our effective school monitoring and tracking systems ensured that we were able to provide children with the right support to make outstanding progress during the year (please see the website link for average progress figures). In fact, the hard work over the past couple of years means that we anticipate outstanding results for children currently in Year 6 at the end of this academic year.

Thank you to FOWHS for agreeing to fund new Chromebooks for the children to use to support their learning. This will really help us to improve the quality of education, particularly in terms of delivery of the Computing Curriculum. We are excited to see the impact in classrooms. I have also recently contacted FOWHS with a request for resources to develop our Design and Technology and Computing Curriculum further, so that we are able to provide highly effective learning experiences in these areas for all the children.
