Message from our Headteacher

The start of a school year always has a feeling of *'topping'* and *'tailing'* to some degree. It has been really lovely to say "hello" to some of the children who left us in the summer for secondary school. These children truly 'blossomed' in their time with us and not only do they look so grown-up in their new uniforms, but they also spoke about how well-prepared and confident they feel in their new learning and lessons. Likewise, I know you will all join me in wishing our new Reception and Nursery starters a very warm William Hogarth School welcome to our school. It has been a joy getting to meet our youngest children this week and I know I speak for the Early Years team when I say how proud we are of them: they have been resilient, determined, fun, engaging and polite. The team are thrilled to be working with such confident children and are excited to see how the children 'blossom' in their learning this year.

This week was filled with trips and enrichment:

- Piano and guitar lessons have restarted and this year, children also have the opportunity to learn the violin. If you are interested in your child learning an instrument, do please contact the office team who will be able to signpost you. Rock Steady will be back in school shortly and this is a great way for children from Reception through to Year 6 to learn to sing or play an instrument like the drums or electric guitar as part of a group. If you have a budding rock star in the house, please do contact the office so that your child can join in. Our music specialist was in school yesterday and singing assembly is always such a special event for staff and children alike.
- Year 3 and Year 5 visited the Horniman Museum on Tuesday to enrich their learning in history. They took part in some brilliant workshops linked to the Stone Age and the Benin Kingdom and were really able to get up close to and handle a range of relevant artefacts. Year 4 visited the hydroponic farm in Piccadilly - we are investigating whether we can become a sponsored school, so that more children can explore the possible future of food production. This afternoon, Year 2 will be visiting Hogarth House as part of their investigation into local history
- Next week, Year 6 are off to Home Farm for their residential. Fingers crossed the weather will stay kind, but don't forget to pack wellies!

I look forward to seeing many of you at the Year 1 – Year 5 'Meet The Teacher' meetings on Monday after school. Support staff will be providing child care during the meetings as I know there will be lots to take on board. If you cannot attend the meeting, please do not worry – all of the information will be available on the website for you to go through.

Financial Help

Free Money for Childcare and After-School Clubs and Holiday Camps

It is a really difficult time at the moment with bills, rent and food prices all soaring. At The William Hogarth School, we are continually looking at ways to help out our community and try to alleviate some of the pressures families are facing.

Tax -Free Childcare which is a government scheme to help working families with the costs of childcare is something that could help you with current costs. It is not only for 15/30 hours free childcare for nursery aged children (if entitled) but also includes wrap around provision such as **breakfast and after-school care** as well as **after-school clubs** for children up to the age of 11.

Tax-Free Childcare is a bank account that is set up in your child's name and for every £8 you put in, the government will top up with another £2 - up to a maximum of £2000 a year. You must pay out to an organisation that is Ofsted registered - (schools and lots of sports clubs are) and then you pay for your provision through the scheme. If you earn under £100,000, it is likely that you are eligible to claim.

Check out the other eligibility criteria and sign up at <https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare> - it's very easy! This can therefore be used towards our after school clubs and with Let's Leap breakfast and after school care provision.
