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Those of you who know me, will appreciate my shock and disbelief at the publication of our Key Stage 2 results. I can only describe it as one of the hardest professional blows of my career. I am devastated – not for me, but for the children and their teachers who worked so hard and so tirelessly.

I know, and I am sure you will agree, we have a hugely dedicated and talented staff. We observe the staff regularly, monitor the quality of children's work in their books and assess them regularly. We took significant action to address the very low starting points of the children at the start of the year, from Saturday School to Easter School, booster classes and interventions: we made sure that every second counted for them.

Although the results appear massively disappointing, they do not tell the whole story. They do not show what makes each of these children special and unique. They do not tell the story of the individual, personal challenges many of the children overcame. They do not tell you who was in hospital. They do not show the incredible in-year progress the children made through hard work and determination, with the support of their outstanding teachers.

These results tell us something about the children who sat the assessments, but they do not tell us everything.

# Key Stage 2, 2018-19 Further Information

## Reading:

- 12 children missed Exp+ by 4 points or less
- These 12 children made an average 17 months in-year progress
- Average in-year progress for children who did not reach ARE = 14 months

## Mathematics:

- 4 children missed Exp+ by 4 points or less
- These 4 children made an average 27.5 months in-year progress
- Average in-year progress for children who did not make ARE = 27 months
