Message from the Headteacher

This week, we have had a whole school focus on supporting good mental health. This is such a critical issue following the disruption of Covid-19 and the removal / moth-balling of so much infrastructure that ensured children and young people had the help they needed as early as possible.


As a result, the timetable was a little more fluid than usual to provide the children with the opportunity to do some deep thinking about themselves, what makes them truly happy and what is really important to them. It was wonderful to see them so engaged with the array of mindfulness activities that were on offer, from breathwork to meditation to yoga. All the year groups also had an opportunity to spend extra time outside, not just developing a better understanding of the benefits of physical activity to their mental health, but also exploring the power of contribution in building a sense of connection to community.

If you have been following the school's Twitter feed : @Hogarth_the you will have been thrilled to stay abreast of the children's performance in this week's football tournament. The Lower Key Stage 2 girls' and boys' teams had the opportunity to compete against 6 other local primary school teams. They demonstrated a real sense of team – one of our fundamental school values, together with excellent fair play and sportsmanship. Their behaviour was impeccable and they were a real credit to the whole school. I know you will join me in congratulating them on their 3rd place positions in the tournament! Well done – this is a superb achievement!

On Tuesday, we had a visitor from Art UK to see how we have implemented the Superpower of Looking toolkit, which is currently in developmental phase. In Key Stage 2, the children have been using this in place of Word of the Day to develop their vocabulary in context and build cultural capital through history of art. After visiting 30 odd schools, Shane was absolutely blown away by our children – their vocabulary, their confidence, their insight. Well done Key Stage 2!

Once again, communication with parents has flagged up as the area that we need to improve upon as a school. Staff have already had training on the system and will spend the end of February and beginning of March familiarising themselves with the system thoroughly. During the second half of March we will be rolling this out to parents – I would urge you to come to one of the launch meetings to find out all about this powerful tool and how it can help you keep up to date with what your child is doing in school and enable you to provide your support for learning at home. Dates for launch events will go into the school calendar.



I hope you enjoy the wonderful hearts of love and gratitude that the children have created this week. Have a lovely half term – rest, relax and enjoy spending time together. Hopefully the weather will stay kind so that you can all get out and about.


A reminder that there will be no after school clubs the week after half term. Clubs will restart week commencing 28th February.


Please support your children and the school raise money for new reading resources. One child has the opportunity to win £20 worth of Usborne Books by raising the most sponsorship money across the whole school.



Year 2

Matisse have had another exciting week as this half term draws to a close. This week has been mental health awareness week so we have all been completing a gratitude diary and meditating after lunch to help calm us and give us greater control of ourselves. We have all decorated hearts and written compliments to one another.

We also had safer internet day on Tuesday so we read 'Digi-duck and the magic castle'. Then we discussed what was safe to go online and what should be kept private.



In English this half term we have been looking at version of the story 'Jack and the beanstalk'. So, this week we have planted our own beans and have written instructions on how to plant them.



In science we have been learning about hygiene. We conducted an experiment to find out what was the best way to wash our hands. First we covered our hands in glue and glitter and imagined that each speck of glitter was a germ. Then each table washed their hands in a different way.

Yujiro only used a paper towel which was very ineffective. Eleanor only had 5 seconds of water and some soap so lots of glitter 'germs' was left behind. We found the best way to wash our hands was to use soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
